**RICE SCHOLARSHIP WINNER CHOSEN.** Ms. Jayne E. Dewig, a Mater Dei High School senior who is graduating fourth in her class, has been selected as the first recipient of the David L. Rice Scholarship. She expects to pursue a degree in the USI Division of Science and Mathematics, with a specific field still to be decided. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Dewig of 3401 Detroy Road, she will receive a full four-year scholarship if she meets the requirements of successfully completing 12 credits per semester while maintaining at least a 3.2 cumulative grade point average.

The Rice Endowment funds scholarships for students of promise, regardless of financial need or place of residence. It was initiated by the USI Faculty Council in 1985, when USI became Indiana's sixth state university, to honor the man who guided the development of the University toward separation. President Rice came to Evansville in 1967 as the first administrative head of the Evansville campus of Indiana State University, was dean of the campus from 1967 to 1971, then president until July, 1985, when the new USI Board of Trustees named him the first USI president.

**RAMESSES TOUR HAS OPENINGS.** Openings still are available for the July weekend trip to Memphis, Tennessee, to see the Ramesses exhibition of more than 70 priceless artifacts on loan from the Egyptian Museum in Cairo. Ramesses the Great ruled Egypt during the period when Memphis on the Nile was Egypt's capital. Now, more than 3,000 years later, the Ramesses exhibit comes to Memphis on the Mississippi. It features gold jewelry, funerary pieces, dishware and vessels, statues, and the world's first known clock. In size and scope, the exhibit is considered more important than the King Tut exhibit. **Dr. Daniel Scavone**, USI professor of history, will accompany the tour group to provide expert commentary on the background and history of the exhibit.

From the Congressional Calendar observing U.S. Constitution Bicentennial: This week in history, 1787 -- Convention debated issues of executive power, methods of choosing national judiciary judges, federal veto power over state laws, size and nature of state delegations, congressional terms, 19 "Virginia Plan" resolutions on Constitutional issues; James Madison wrote Thomas Jefferson about Convention's "powerful effect on our destiny;" Convention approved selection of U. S. Senate by state legislatures; Edward Carrington wrote that the "Convention...is rousing the attention of the Empire;" North Carolina delegation petitioned their governor for increased compensation; William Paterson proposed "New Jersey Plan" of limited changes to Articles of Confederation.
