AMERICAN ISSUES FORUM. Morton J. Frisch, Professor of Political Science at Northern Illinois University, will be the featured speaker in the American Issues class for December 3, 1975. The topic of his presentation will be "The Origins and Nature of Representative Government in America."

Dr. Frisch, Fulbright Professor of Political Science at the University of Stockholm in 1963-64 and former faculty

member of the College of William and Mary in Virginia, has co-edited and co-authored The Thirties with Martin Diamond, American Political Thought with Richard G. Stevens, The Political Thought of American Statesmen with Richard G. Stevens, and has recently published Franklin D. Roosevelt: The Contribution of the New Deal to American Political Thought and Practice. He has published essays in the area of American political thought in Ethics, the Journal of Politics and the Review of Politics.

Quentin Davis, Assistant Professor of Political Science, will be the featured speaker December 10, discussing "The President: An Elected Executive," under the broad topic "A More Perfect Union."

HUMANITIES FORUM. Ms. Marilyn Durham, Evansville author of The Man Who Loved Cat Dancing and Dutch Uncle, will be the featured speaker for the next Humanities Forum scheduled for Thursday, December 4 at 1:00 p.m. in the Rare Books Room in the Library. The topic of her talk will be "The Evolution of a Novel," in which she will discuss the growth of her novels, from the germination of ideas to their flowering in the form of best sellers. The Humanities Forum is open to the public. Meetings generally do not exceed one hour in length and include ample time for questions.

REGIONAL MEDICAL FORUM TO BE HELD IN EVANSVILLE. Patrick J. V. Corcoran, M.D., Director, Indiana University School of Medicine, Evansville Center, will host the Regional Medical Forum scheduled to meet in Evansville at 3:00 p.m. in the Executive Inn on Monday, December 8, 1975. Among matters to be discussed are the impact of the Indiana Statewide System for Medical Education, the future of state's Family Practice Residency Program, community incentives for attracting physicians, the role of comprehensive health care planning, and licensure standards for foreign medical graduates.

A series of regional forums has been slated during November and December, and will take place across the state of Indiana. The Regional Medical Forums, sponsored by four important agencies concerned with health care, have been scheduled to learn what people think of the health care delivery system in Indiana, and to foster candid discussion of relevant issues. Concerned citizens will be given ample opportunity to hear and be heard on the issues.
