In commemoration of Saul Bellow's recent achievement in receiving the Nobel Prize for literature, Professor Waitman will present a lecture entitled: "Saul Bellow's Novels: Angst, Nuttiness, and Truth." The forum will begin at 12:00 noon.

The December 8 Humanities Forum will be a lecture by *THOMAS WILHELMUS*, Assistant Professor of English, entitled: "Current Issues in Mythology." The lecture will include a brief survey of the history of myth and will culminate in pointing out recent innovations in mythography as well as showing how political ideology and "civil religion" act as modern substitutes for earlier myth. The lecture will be held in the Rare Books Room beginning at 9:00 a.m.

THE CHANGEOVER TO THE "DIMENSION" TELEPHONE SYSTEM, Phase I of the new "Dimension" Telephone System was cut over on Saturday, November 20, 1976. All indications are that the system is operating effectively and should provide efficient telephone communications for the campus. It is hoped that within a short time, and with a little practice, everyone will be utilizing all the features of the Dimension system to improve the campus telephone communications.

Please remember that the long distance call slips (pink slip) must still be completed when a long distance telephone call is made. This will be necessary until Phase II of the conversion to the Dimension System is completed, approximately March, 1977, which will give us direct inward dialing to individual stations, and the automatic identification of outward long distance calls. Also, please remember that no personal calls are to be charged to the University telephone number.
