**HOLIDAY ART EXHIBIT.** The Holiday Art Exhibit, an exhibition of 7th and 8th grade original art and crafts, will be on display on the second level of the University Library December 6, 1974 through December 11, 1974. There will be a reception in the Faculty Reading Room on Sunday, December 8, 1974, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Evansville Area Council of Parent-Teachers Associations and the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation's Art Program are co-sponsors.

**SPECIAL ART EXHIBIT ON CAMPUS.** The Lakeside Studio presents a special one-day exhibition of original prints to be held Thursday, December 5, 1974, from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. in the trophy hall of the Administration Building. Everyone is invited to view this unique collection of the Lakeside Studio from Lakeside, Michigan and meet their Director, John D. Wilson, who will be glad to answer questions both historical and technical.

### SPECIAL ART EXHIBIT, CONTINUED.

The works to be exhibited here contain prints by old and modern master artists such as Durer, Callot, Piranesi, Blake, Rouault, Villon, and Whistler. There will be prints by contemporary artists Antreasian, Hayter, Hunt, Peterdi, Tobey and many others. Also in the collection will be a number of proof impressions from the Henry Wolf estate and a group of Japanese Woodcuts from the Ukiyo-e School.

**MADRIGAL DINNERS TO OPEN CHRISTMAS SEASON.** The Christmas season on the ISUE campus will begin with the Madrigal Dinners scheduled for December 6, 7, and 8. Now in the fifth year, the Madrigal Dinners are modeled after the custom of Tudor England. During the federal system, the occupants of the manor house of each estate celebrated Advent by giving a banquet and inviting friends and relatives. Each course of the meal, served in the great hall of the mansion, was heralded by music of brass instruments. Skilled court jesters completed the festivities.

Painstaking effort is made to recreate the regal pomp and pageantry that characterized Christmas in the 16th century. The evening begins when the herald trumpets announce the arrival of the singers who enter with song and dance. Strolling minstrels and instrumentalists entertain the guests while they are waiting for the trumpet fanfare which announces the carrying in of the steaming wassail bowl. Then all lift their cups in a toast to the festival of the Christmas season. Each course is likewise heralded in medieval pageantry. While guests dine, they are entertained by such instruments as recorders, lutes, and zithers, as well as being entertained by the charming antics of the court jester. Following the banquet, the Mid-America Singers entertain with their round of Madrigal singing.

The Madrigal Dinner menu consists of Wassail, Roast Beef, Baked Potato, Green Beans Amandine, Cranberry Salad, Hard Rolls, Plum Pudding and Coffee.

Tickets for the Madrigal Dinners are available for the December 6 performance and a limited supply is available for the December 8 performance. Cost of tickets is \$7.50 per person and may be obtained by calling *Candy Roscoe* in the Humanities Division on ext. 234.
