NEW FLAG FLYING OVER ISUE. A

Bicentennial Flag is now flying on the ISUE flagpoles beside the United States flag, the State of Indiana flag, and the flag of the United Nations. STRONGEST MAN TO BE AT CENTRAL ARENA. A weightlifting contest sponsored by The Evansville Freedom Festival will take place at the ISUE Central Arena on June 28 at 2:30 p.m. Paul Anderson, the strongest man in the world, is scheduled to perform a weightlifting demonstration before the competition begins. Two teams, one from Evansville and one from Kentucky, will be pitted against each other in the competition. The contest will be open to the public with no admission fee.

ECONOMICS CLASS TO BE ADDRESSED BY MAYOR LLOYD. On Thursday, June 26, 1975 the "Economics of Urban Problems" class taught by *J. Eliseo DaRosa*, Professor of Economics, will be held in the Mayor's Office of the Evansville Civic Center. Mayor Russell Lloyd will address the class on the topic of "Crime and Criminal Justice in Evansville." The class is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m., with a question/answer period following the Mayor's address. Local media will cover this first-time event in which the city administration has worked with a class at ISUE.

ISUE LIBRARY BECOMES MEMBER OF ALSA. The ISUE Library received approval of the ISU Board of Trustees at their June meeting to become members of the Four Rivers Area Library Services Authority and the Evansville Area Health Science Library Consortium. ALSA is a cooperative association of all types of libraries within a geographical region. ISUE is located in area 13 which includes eleven southwest counties containing 31 school libraries, 3 vocational libraries, 2 junior college libraries, 4 academic libraries, 10 special libraries (law, medical, historical, etc.), 5 hospital libraries, 1 correctional school library, and 1 residential school library. *Charles M. Lonnberg*, Director of Library, will be on the ALSA board of directors.

The Evansville Area Health Science Library Consortium consists of institutions or agencies in this area (universities, hospitals, etc.) that have health science libraries. The interlibrary loan service will be represented by *Mrs. Ruth Hahn*, Reader Services Librarian, who will serve as secretary of this group. *Mr. Lonnberg* will be the representative to the Consortium.
