EARTH SHELTERED HOUSING TELECONFERENCE. On Saturday, March 26th, at Indiana State University Evansville and some thirty universities throughout the country, participants will explore earth-sheltered housing issues with national experts via satellite telecommunications. The program "Earth Sheltered Housing" is produced by the Division of Engineering, Technology, and Architecture, at Oklahoma State University.

After presentations by experts in this field, participants can discuss their questions with experts and colleagues around the country. Discussion at each university, led by faculty, will focus on related case studies.
