COMMENCEMENT 1978. ISUE awarded 369 baccalaureate and associate degrees to students in the University's eighth Commencement exercises held Saturday morning May 13 at the ISUE Arena.

GREGORY BROWN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert G. Brown of 5120 Oak Hill Road, received the highest academic award in the ceremony. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 index and was awarded the distinction of Summa Cum Laude.

Sixteen students graduated with the distinction Magna Cum Laude (3.80 GPA or higher) and nineteen students received Cum Laude status (3.60-3.79 GPA).

The Commencement address was delivered by Mayor Russell Lloyd. Honorary degree recipients were Lloyd; George Ashworth, Superintendent of the Metropolitan School District of Mt. Vernon; Robert J. Fair, Princeton attorney; and William H. Miller, Judge of the Vanderburgh Circuit Court.
