PUBLIC READINGS AT WRITERS' CONFERENCE.

The 1980 Ohio River Writers' Conference includes a conference banquet open to the public, August 7, and public readings on August 8 and 9 at 7:30 p.m.

Robert Buffington, editor of the University of Georgia Press, will be the featured speaker at the banquet. A former Teaching Fellow at the University of Iowa and Vanderbilt Scholar at Vanderbilt University, Buffington has had essays and reviews published in

numerous periodicals, including the "Hudson Review," "Modern Age," "The Sewanee Review," "The Michigan Quarterly Review" and the "Georgia Review." In 1978 he was awarded a \$20,000 fellowship for independent study and research by the National Endowment for the Humanities for the authorized biography of Allen Tate. Mr. Buffington is the author of The Equilibrist: A Study of John Crowe Ransom's Poem's, 1961-1963.

Buffington's topic at the banquet will be "Writing as a Vocation: The Example of Allen Tate." The banquet which will be at 7:00 p.m. will be preceded by a social hour beginning at 6:00 p.m. Reservations are \$6.50 each.

On Friday, August 8, Barry Hannah, distinguished American novelist and short story writer, will give a reading at 7:30 p.m. in Room A34. Managing editor of "Black Box" magazine, Elizabeth Wray will read "Double Shift," a one-act play in Room A126 at 7:30 p.m.

Saturday evening, poets Ai and H.E. Van Brunt will give a poetry reading in Room UC350 at 7:30 p.m. A reception will be held both nights in Room UC 308 following the readings.

The Writers' Conference is sponsored by ISUE and the Evansville Arts and Education Council with the support of the Indiana Arts Commission and National Endowment for the Arts. Participating on the Writers' Conference committee are WALTER EVERETT, assistant professor of English; ROBERT McDOWELL, assistant professor of English; SYLVIA NEFF WEINZAPFEL, assistant director of continuing education; and, THOMAS WILHELMUS, associate professor of English.
