



AWARDED GRANT. JOHN MCNAUGHTON, Associate Professor of Art, has been awarded an \$8,000 grant from the Bicentennial Commission and the Indiana Commission for the creation of a steel sculpture to be erected for the Evansville Museum. The abstract sculpture, depicting the flowing and bending of the Ohio River, will be located outside the Museum adjacent to the river. MR. MCNAUGHTON'S sculpture, chosen from over 25 entries from throughout the Midwest, will reach a height of 10 feet and be constructed from corten

steel. The sculpture is to be completed before Thanksgiving.
