ISUE WHEELCHAIR ATHLETES

The ISUE Secretaries' Club has voted to donate \$100 to ISUE's two wheelchair athletes, *David Angermeier* and *Carol Arnold*, for their trip to the national wheelchair track meet in Spokane, Washington.

Last month, 12 members of the Tri-State Wheelers, the track and relay team of the Evansville Rehabilitation Center, competed in a regional meet at Davenport, Iowa. Four members of the team, including *David* and *Carol*, placed high enough to qualify for the 1974 national meet June 16-17 in Spokane, Washington.

David, a light heavyweight and a junior at ISUE, is a weightlifter and pressed 230 pounds to qualify. *Carol*, a sophomore at ISUE, is the regional champion in table tennis.

Air fare for the team is \$1,800 and the Rehabilitation Center hopes to cover this cost by donations from groups or individuals.

PEOPLE IN THE NEWS

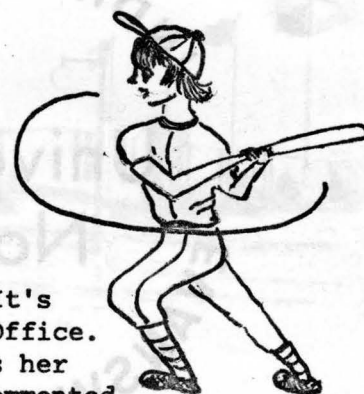
