APPLICATION FOR GRADUATION

The policy statement in the ISUE Bulletin states, "All candidates for graduation must file with the Registrar's Office a formal application for graduation no later than the third week of the final semester preceding Commencement. The application for graduation may be obtained at the Office of the Divisional Chairman of the candidate's major."

COUNSELING SERVICES FILLS NEW POSITION

William E. Couch has assumed the position of Associate Dean for Counseling Services at Indiana State University Evansville. The creation of this new position was a reflection of the need to coordinate the advising of veterans and of students who are undecided or have not yet selected an academic major field for a degree program.

Mr. Couch's office will also coordinate the part-time employment programs to bring together the part-time student with the interested employer who has part-time employment needs. His office is located in the student services area.

Mr. Couch was formerly head of counseling at Bosse High School prior to joining the Indiana State University Evansville faculty as Assistant Professor of Education and Supervisor of Student Teaching.
