ISUE SUMMER SPORTS CAMPS. This year, ISUE is offering five summer sports camps in the new HPER building, conducted by ISUE coaches and assistants.

"Basketball for Boys," taught by Basketball Coach WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE and his assistant KAE MOORE, will feature guest lectures from area coaches. For boys age 9 or older, the course will include individual and team drills to

teach basketball techniques and skills. The camp will meet Monday through Thursday, June 9 through 26, from 8:15 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. The registration fee of \$50.00 is reduced to \$20.00 for children of ISUE faculty and staff.

ISUE's Women's Basketball Coach RUTH WALLER, assisted by area high school coaches and collegiate players, will conduct a basketball camp for girls ages 9 to 18. The program will focus on basketball fundamentals to develop maximum potential in game situations, game strategy, and individual and team offense and defense. The camp will be offered Monday through Thursday, July 14 through 24, from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The registration fee is \$30.00.

Open to any grade school or high school student or cheerleading squad, the Cheerleading Clinic will be directed by RUTH WALLER. Included in the clinic will be competition, chants and yells, pom-pom routines, mounts, cheerleading gymnastics, and double stunts. The clinic will meet Monday through Friday, June 9 through 13, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. The registration fee is \$20.00.

Volleyball for Boys and Girls, ages 10 through 18, includes instruction in the fundamentals of volleyball, individual and team drills, basic team strategy, and offensive patterns. The camp will be directed by ISUE Volleyball Coach DEBBIE SCHUTTE assisted by volleyball players from ISUE and other area colleges. Volleyball will meet Monday through Thursday, July 7 through 17, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. The registration fee is \$40.00.

Soccer camp will be offered for players entering grades 4 through 12. ISUE Soccer Coach TERRY SHROCK will direct the camp and will be assisted by Indiana University Coach Jerry Yeagley and other outstanding college coaches and players. Children of faculty and staff can enroll for the fee of \$50.00 instead of the regular fee of \$90.00.

All camp participants will receive an ISUE T-shirt. For further information, contact the Athletic Office at 464-1846.

ACCESS ROAD NAMED CLARKE LANE. The access road between University Boulevard and Schutte Road has been officially named Clarke Lane in honor of Monsignor Thomas J. Clarke, retired chancellor of the Evansville Diocese. Father Clarke was chairman of the Evansville Diocesan insurance commission at the time Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. led a community fund drive to secure real estate for the Mid-America University Center and ISUE. It was through Father Clarke's efforts that 220 acres of land owned by the Catholic Diocese of Evansville was donated to SIHE early in the drive.
