SPICE UP YOUR DAY AT CHILI COOK-OFF. Tim Buecher, chairman of ISUE'S first Chili Cook-Off team, says he is under a lot of pressure in the final days before Saturday's competition for the Freedom Festival chili-cooking championship. Those attending the event, either as team members or ISUE supporters, will not lack for either entertainment or a gastronomical experience.

Buecher claims the distinctive taste of the ISUE chili can be attributed to the eight different kinds of peppers used, several of which have just been flown in from Texas. The recipe the ISUE team will use is over 100 years old and comes from Buecher's great-grandmother, Felicitas Espina of Torreon, Mexico. The legend accompanying the recipe is that his great-grandfather saved the lives of Pancho Villa and Emiliano Zapata during the Mexican Revolution. As a reward, Pancho Villa entrusted his secret chili recipe to great grandfather Espina for safekeeping. It has been handed down from generation to generation (because no one would keep it) and now is kept in a Mason jar four feet underground in Blairsville, Indiana.

Entertainment, in the form of cheers, skits, and songs, will be provided by the ISUE Feathershakers, assisted by a few appropriately renamed staff -- Harold "Kool Aid" Calloway, Bob "Botulism" Harper, and Lori "Speedy Gonzales" Carroll. All this craziness will take place on the downtown walkway between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. The ISUE team promises the event will be a "stirring experience" for everyone, and invites you to stop by for free chili samples, snow cones and soft drinks.
