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USI holding 20th anniversary classes in Warrick County

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Seven courses will be available at Castle High School, Newburgh, next spring as part of the regular off-campus program taken to the students by the University of Southern Indiana. This is the 20th anniversary for the program at Castle, USI's oldest off-campus site.

Courses meet general education requirements and have few, if any, prerequisites. They are selected from the regular curriculum and are those USI students typically take during their first four semesters at the University. Communications and English composition are required courses offered regularly at Castle. Spring classes also will include algebra, introductory psychology, humanities, literature, and political science.

In addition to the convenience of off-campus courses for residents in Warrick and surrounding counties, the classes usually have lower enrollments than the same courses on campus, thus providing a more favorable student/teacher ratio.

Off-campus courses also are available at Nativity School on Pollack Avenue, on Evansville's southeast side. The courses are similar to those at Castle, but also offer day-time classes, Monday through Thursday.

Anyone interested in classes at Castle or Nativity is urged to contact USI Enrollment Services, 464-1765, prior to December 1, so that admissions procedures and academic skills testing may be completed to facilitate enrollment.
