1995 USI BASEBALL OUTLOOK

"Taking it one step farther"

n 1995, the University of Southern Indiana baseball team is looking to take its season one step farther.

In the last four seasons, the Screaming Eagles have had 30-plus wins each year, including 40-wins in 1992 and 1993; been to the NCAA Division II Tournament three straight seasons; won the Great Lakes Valley Conference regular season twice; and the conference championship once. But, the team has yet to achieve a berth in the NCAA II Championship series.

In 1994, the Eagles jumped out to a sixth-place national ranking, 19-5 overall record, and a 4-0 GLVC mark early in the year before being slowed by a five-game losing streak, including four conference games.

USI finished the season 36-19, fought back, and gained a spot in the GLVC Tournament and earned an at-large bid to the North Central Regional of the NCAA II Tournament. In both cases, USI finished second to Lewis University, who finished third in the NCAA II Tournament.

In 1995, the Eagles return five of the nine starting positions (including the designated hitter), three starting pitchers, and the stopper out of the bullpen. The big hole is at catcher with the departure of two-time All-American Kevin Brown, who was drafted by the Texas Rangers in the second round of the Major League Baseball Amatuer Draft.

USI Head Coach Mike Goedde, entering his second season, has 14 returning and 15 new players to compete in a very tough spring schedule. To go with an always-tough GLVC schedule, the Eagles have added NCAA Division I Indiana University, Austin Peay State University, and the University of Tennessee-Martin, which join Division I Murray State University on the schedule from last season.

The 1995 schedule also will feature future GLVC teams Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, Quincy University, and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

The Pitching Staff

The Eagles return five veteran pitchers from 1994. They claimed 23 of the 36 victories, and had a 3.40 ERA in 264.6 innings pitched in 1994.

Leading the way will be two senior left-handers, **Todd Niemeier** and **Mike Fetscher.**

Niemeier, as a starting pitcher, was second in the rotation in wins with a 7-2 record and 3.17 ERA in 82.3 innings. The 82.3 innings fell two short of the single-season record he set in 1993. The first-team All-GLVC and All-North Central Region performer currently ranks fourth all-time in innings pitched (232.0), fifth in complete games (14), strikeouts (147), and wins (19).

Out of the bullpen, Fetscher, who was a third team All-American in 1994, tied his own single-season record for wins with an 8-1 record and a 3.21 ERA in 53.3 innings pitched. He led the team in saves and set a new USI all-time record with 10. The two-time All-American also ranks number two in strikeouts (174), three all-time in shutouts (3) and wins (20).

Also returning from last season from the left side is sophomore **Kadish Evans.** Evans was 2-4 with a 4.40 ERA in 45.0 innings

pitched. After a rough start, Evans became one of USI's most reliable starting pitchers, including a start in the North Central Regionals, and out of the bullpen, recording a save.

Another returning left-hander is sophomore **Steve Baker**. Baker saw limited action, but was 1-0 with a 4.40 ERA in 9.3 innings.

From the right side, USI returns junior **Craig Shoobridge**, who leads returning pitchers with a 3.01 ERA in 74.7 innings. Shoobridge had a 5-4 record and led the team with three shutouts.

Out of the bullpen, USI has junior right-hander **Shayne Stock,** who is making the switch from first base to the mound.

The Infielders

USI returns three of five starters from the 1994 infield which had 45 double plays.

Up the middle, USI returns senior shortstop **Barry Strauser**, who was second team All-GLVC in 1994, and junior second baseman **Korey Lamb**.

Senior left-handed pitcher Todd Niemeier will become the USI all-time leader for innings pitched in 1995.

Strauser, who started every game for the Eagles, hit .306 with 32 RBIs, scored 48 runs and stole 21 bases, which was second on the team. Lamb hit .267 with 24 runs scored and nine doubles.

At first base, USI has second team All-North Central Region and All-GLVC **Jason Krack**, a senior. Krack, who was named All-Tournament at the NCAA II North Central Regional for the third straight season, set a school record with 64 RBIs, while hitting .365 with 15 doubles and 11 home runs.

At third base, sophomore infielder **Kevin Irons** will compete for the position. Irons, who was USI's designated hitter in 1994, hit .319 with 36 RBIs and three home runs.

Behind the plate, senior catcher **Darryl Adler** will have to try and fill the shoes vacated by Kevin Brown, who led the Eagles in hitting and home runs in 1994.


Last season, Adler, who filled in at catcher when Brown was injured, hit .259 in 23 games and 18 starts.

Returning to join Adler behind the plate is sophomore **Andy Hoffman**, who hit .304 in 23 plate appearances in 17 games.

The Outfield

For the first time in three seasons, the USI outfield will have to undergo major changes.

Gone from last season is centerfielder Matt Vince, who is USI's all-time leader in hits and stolen bases, and leftfielder Stu Sheets, who is USI's all time leader in doubles.



Returning to patrol rightfield is senior **Ryan Seidl**. Seidl hit .259 with 22 RBIs, four home runs, and nine doubles.

Competing for the centerfield job will be freshman **Jason Engelbrecht.** He was sidelined last season due to ankle problems, but should be able to provide the offense in the top of the lineup to ease the departure of Vince and Sheets.


The Newcomers

With departure of the five seniors from last year's team and the return of only 14 players from a year ago, Goedde has 10 new players to fill the holes.

On the mound, the Eagles picked up some experience with junior righthander **Drew Durham** from Greenfield, Ind., who pitched for Wabash Valley Junior College last season. Joining Durham is freshmen righthander **Kyle Wagner** from Evansville, Ind., and lefthander **Doug Allison** from Van Buren, Ind.

Around the infield, USI picked up some experienced help in two-time junior college All-American **Craig Carpenter** a junior infielder from Bel Air, Md., who played for Harford Community College last year; sophomore infielder **Chad Montgomery** from Wabash, Ind., who played for Southwestern Michigan Junior College in 1994; and sophomore catcher **Toby Wolfe** from Evansville, Ind., who played for Butler University last season. Coming to USI as a freshman infielder is **Jeremy Jones** from Evansville, Ind. Also incoming as a freshman is catcher **Rich Eyler** from Loogootee, Ind.

The Eagles have two players competing with the returning outfielders for the the two open slots. USI picked up an experienced outfielders in junior Sam Marx, who returns to Evansville after playing two years at John A. Logan College (Ill.). Along with Marx, USI picked up freshman outfielder Chad Ailstock from Van Buren, Ind.



Senior infielder Jason Krack has been named to the NCAA Division II North Central Regional All-Tournament team three consecutive seasons, twice at third base and once at first base.



THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA BASEBALL FIELD

The USI baseball field became the permanent home of the Screaming Eagles 21 years ago and has seen many great players and great games. Today, it stands as one of the premiere playing surfaces in southern Indiana and the NCAA Division II.

Located on the USI campus, it has concession stands, media accommodations in the press box, seating for approximately 200 fans, and restrooms. In close proximity to the field is the Bent Twig Outdoor Education Center, a picnic/nature area, down the left- and rightfield lines.

In the outfield, the dimensions measure 355 ft. down the lines, 375 ft. to the power alleys, and 385 ft. to dead center field. The entire area is maintained by a computerized-underground sprinkler system, installed in 1992. Behind the fence is a beautiful tree line which provides an excellent hitting background.

As the program has developed, so has the playing field. In 1987, two all-weather batting cages and a 15-ft. warning track along the

outfield fence were added to the facitity. The summer of 1989 brought resurfacing of the infield with a special blend of brickdust to create an all-weather field. Resurfaced in the fall of 1994, the brick-dust is complemented by a tarp which covers the entire infield. The tarp enables the Eagles to play and practice when most teams in the midwest are rained out.

The nine-inning scoreboard was added in 1993. It has high visibility with inning-by-inning scoring and current runs, hits, and errors displayed.

During the summer, the field is home to the Funkhouser American Legion team which hosted the 1994 American Legion Tournament. The diamond became a practice facility for movie stars such as Madonna, during the making of the movie *A League* of Their Own in August of 1992.

HEAD COACH MIKE GOEDDE

Mike Goedde is in his second season as head baseball coach at the University of Southern Indiana and successfully led the Eagles to an NCAA II Tournament berth, a second-place finish in the GLVC, and a 36-19 record last year.


Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville under head coach Jim Brownlee from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993. His responsibilities at UE were coaching the pitching staff, coordinating the recruiting, directing the summer camp activities, administering a strength program, and supervising field maintenance.

While at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA in the country with a 2.99. This staff featured major league All-Star Andy Benes, now of the San Diego Padres.

In professional baseball, Goedde was signed as a pitcher in the fourth round of the 1983 draft by the Cincinnati Reds and spent three seasons in their farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Reds organization in the Pioneer League at Billings, Mont.

The Evansville native graduated from UE with a degree in sports administration, and from Mater Dei High School.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is assistant intramural director at USI.

Assistant Coach Chris Barney is the hitting instructor, working with the infielders and outfielders.

Barney joined Goedde's staff in 1993-94 after spending the 1992-93 year at Tusculum College in Greenville, Tenn. Prior to working at Tusculum, Barney spent three-and-a-half years (1989-92) with Tennessee Wesleyan College as an assistant coach. While at both schools, he was responsible for daily practices, field maintenance, and fund raising projects.

Barney graduated from Tennessee Wesleyan with a degree in business administration.

GLVC TO ADD THREE IN 1995-96

INDIANAPOLIS, IND.-The Presidents of the ten Great Lakes Valley Conference member institutions have approved the addition of Quincy University, Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, and the University of Wisconsin Parkside to the league.

Quincy, SIUE, and UWP would begin competing for GLVC titles in 1995-96. The conference sponsors championships in base-ball, basketball (m/w), cross country (m/w), golf (m), soccer (m), softball, tennis (m/w), and volleyball (w).

Currently, the GLVC is an NCAA II conference consisting of 10 schools located in four states. They are Ashland University (Ohio), Bellarmine College (Ky.), University of Indianapolis, Indiana University/Purdue University Ft. Wayne, Lewis University (Ill.), Kentucky Wesleyan, Kentucky State University, Northern Kentucky University, Saint Joseph's College (Ind.), and the University of Southern Indiana. Ashland and Kentucky State will be leaving the GLVC at the conclusion of the 1994-95 year.

Considered one of the toughest conferences in the nation (NCAA Division II), the GLVC sent three champions to the NCAA Final Four in their respective sports this past season. They were Bellarmine (women's basketball), Lewis (Baseball), and USI (men's basketball national finalist).

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools-Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine, and USI (then Indiana State-Evansville)-

began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, Indianapolis and St. Joseph's expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those schools-along with Ashland University-united to become the GLVC.

Lewis joined the conference in 1980, along with IPFW in 1984, NKU in 1985, and KSU in 1989.




