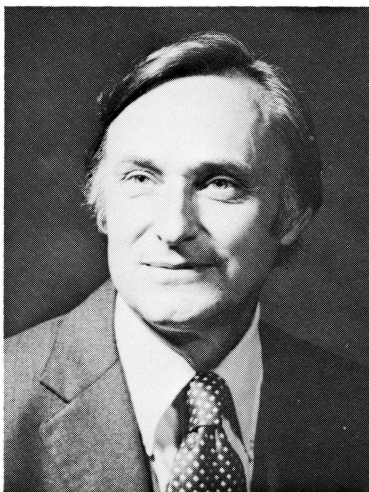

# ABOUT OUR UNIVERSITY

Located in southwestern Indiana, Indiana State University Evansville serves the Tri-State area of Indiana, Kentucky and Illinois, providing academic offerings in baccalaureate and associate degree programs. ISUE also offers credit and noncredit continuing education classes, professional seminars and workshops and special short-course sessions throughout the year through the Office of Continuing Education and General Studies. Selected graduate programs of Indiana State University - Terre Haute are also available on the Evansville campus. The University's Office of Cooperative Professional Practice offers students career-related work experiences with participating area business and industry.

Indiana State University Evansville is accredited by the North Central Association, the National Council of Accreditation of Teacher Education, the Indiana State Department of American Dental Association and the Accreditation Board for Engineering Technology.

ISUE opened its doors to 412 students at the Centennial School in 1965. Today, entering its 17th year of service, the school's enrollment has grown to 3,500 students and its academic degree programs now number more than 70. In 1968, Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., raised funds to purchase 1,400 acres of land for the Mid-America University Center. Since 1969, ISUE has occupied 300 acres in the Mid-America Center, with the first structure, the Science and Administration building, opening its doors in the fall of that year. The Library opened in 1971, followed by the University Center in 1974 and the Technology Center in 1975. Officials proudly cut the ribbon for the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building in October, 1980. Constructed at a cost of more than \$4 million, the building accommodates a variety of instructional activities and services, and provides an on-campus arena for ISUE athletic events.

The Evansville campus is a part of the two-campus system of Indiana State University-Terre Haute. The university has a strong history of service to the State of Indiana since 1870. Richard G. Landini serves as president of the University and David L. Rice is president of the Evansville campus.

Indiana State University is governed by a nine-member board of trustees. Members of the 1981-82 board are Charles W. Ainlay, president; Dan R. Winchell, vice-president; Patricia J. 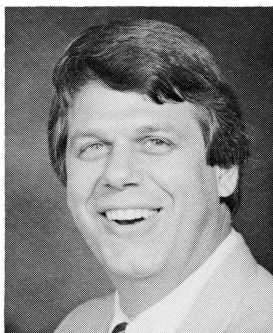


# THE SPIRIT OF EVANSVILLE

---

## **CREIGHTON BURNS ATHLETIC DIRECTOR & HEAD COACH**

---



When Creighton Burns packed his bags and left an assistant coaching job at Armstrong State College in favor of a similar position back in his home state at Indiana State University Evansville, little did he know that less than a year later he would be chosen to succeed Wayne Boultinghouse as both athletic director and head basketball coach. There's no question that Burns has paid his dues to achieve a head coaching position on the collegiate level.

Creighton attended tiny Cromwell High School in northern Indiana, where he was a standout athlete in several sports. Upon graduation he was extended an athletic scholarship to Purdue University, where he earned his Bachelor's degree in Physical Education in 1964. He later attended St. Francis College to complete requirements for his Master's degree. At Purdue, Burns played both basketball and baseball, and following graduation, signed a major league contract with the Minnesota Twins of the American League. He continued to pitch in the Twins organization until an arm injury ended his career in 1967.

That same year Burns began his basketball coaching career at Triton High School in Bourbon, Indiana, and over the next 11 years, also coached at Clinton Central, North Newton, and Twin Lakes high schools. All totaled, he amassed an overall high school coaching record of 163-82, and sent more than 25 players on to the college ranks. The most notable of Creighton's pupils was Rich Rhodes, an All-American at Eastern Illinois University who went on to become an eighth round draft choice of the NBA's Chicago Bulls.

Before coming to ISUE last year, Burns served two seasons as assistant basketball and head cross country coach at Armstrong State in Savannah, Georgia. It is interesting to note that during the two years he was at Armstrong State and again last year, Creighton was involved with coaching a nationally-ranked team. The "Running Pirates" reached the coveted number one ranking in 1979 while last year's "Screaming Eagle" squad was ranked as high as number four.

"I am really looking forward to continuing the winning tradition that Wayne (Boultinghouse) has worked so hard to establish," Burns said after taking over the reigns last spring. "I don't look upon college coaching as being much different than coaching on the high school level. Naturally, the overall talent is much better, but the coach still has to motivate the players the same as on any other level." He continued, "I am excited and real eager for the season to get under way. I won't make any predictions on what kind of record we'll have this year, but I can truthfully say that we will be exciting to watch."

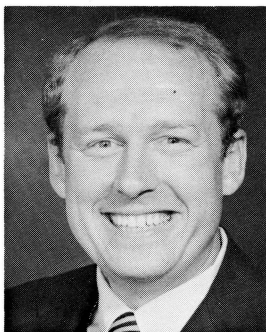

## **ED BAKER ASSISTANT COACH**

---



The newest addition to the "Screaming Eagle" staff this year is Edwin Baker, who fills the vacancy of assistant coach created when Creighton Burns was elevated to athletic director and head coach. Baker comes to ISUE from the small community of Zionsville, Indiana, a suburb of Indianapolis, where he served as both coach and English instructor. He also prepped at Zionsville and was a standout basketball player for several years.

After graduation, he attended Purdue University and made the Boilermaker basketball team as a walk-on. In 1971 Baker received his Bachelor's degree in Physical Education and then went on to Butler University where he completed requirements for his Master's degree in 1976. Even today, Baker is continuing his education through the school of graduate studies at Butler.

His first real coaching break came in 1971 when Creighton Burns offered Baker the assistant coaching job at Clinton Central High School. After four years in that position, he moved back to his hometown to assume the assistant football coaching job for one year at Zionsville High School where he guided the junior varsity team to an undefeated (7-0) and unscored upon season, an accomplishment he is still quite proud of. However, the main reason Baker returned to his alma mater was the opportunity to serve as assistant and head reserve coach with the basketball program. His JV teams at Zionsville amassed an overall record of 48-30 which contributed to Baker's career winning percentage of 60% (88-59) in basketball.

Creighton Burns, once again, played an important role in Baker's career when he notified his longtime friend of the vacant assistant coaching position at ISUE last spring. The likeable big guy eagerly applied for the job and was subsequently hired enabling the two to, once again, reunite a friendship which began 10 years ago at Clinton Central High School.

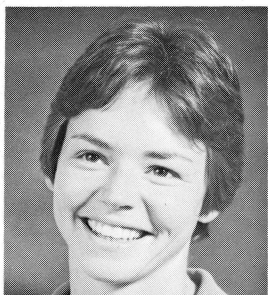
"I really like ISUE," Baker said after his first few months in Evansville. "The things I like most are that people here are very friendly and most cooperative. I'm not just talking about the athletic department, but the whole university and the community as well. There is real kinship among ISUE fans, and that is such an important ingredient in any athletic program. I am looking forward to basketball season and of the excitement that goes with it."

The Baker family includes Ed, wife Judie, seven year-old Carl, and five year-old Kristin. In addition to his coaching duties, he is also an instructor in physical education classes, and is in charge of all athletic promotions for the Eagles.

Collins, who was an all-state selection in high school after averaging 36 ppg., will be looked upon for his team leadership this year both on and off the court.

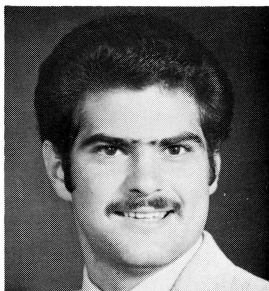

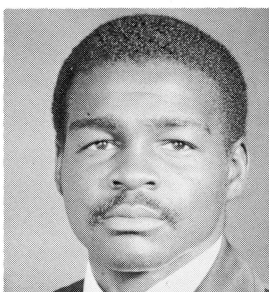

The Memphis, Tennessee, native who is noted for his defensive tenacity, was also a football and baseball standout in high school.

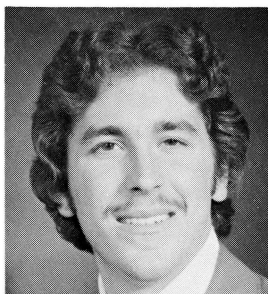

Kelly and the coaching staff are looking for further improvements this year as he is just beginning to realize his full potential.

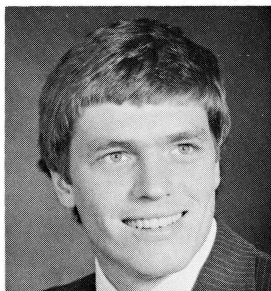

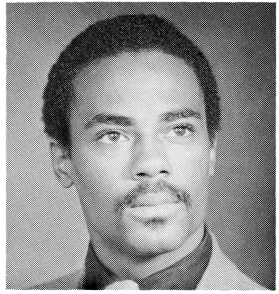

If he can integrate his gift of natural talent with well-rounded team play, the sky is the limit for James

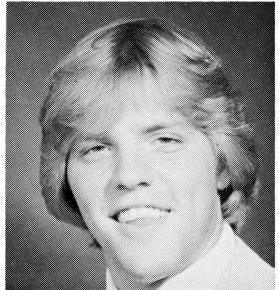

# 1981-82 Outlook: The Challenge Goes On!

With seven returning lettermen including four who were starting last year, it's no wonder that coach Creighton Burns is anxious for the 1981-82 season to get underway. Despite the loss of NABC All-American John Hollinden to graduation, the first-year coach can call upon no less than six players who saw considerable playing time for last year's Great Lakes Valley Conference champions. It won't be easy to improve on last year's 21-8 record, which included the school's second straight NCAA Great Lakes Regional Tournament appearance. However, Burns should have the necessary ingredients, depth and experience are the keys.

Two-year starter John Brown heads the list of returnees. The 6-4 senior forward from Washington (Indiana) High School led all Eagles last year in field goal percentage by connecting on better than 54% of his shots. In addition, he was the team's second-leading scorer at 15.5 ppg and second-leading rebounder grabbing 7.1 caroms/game.

Juniors Cully Nelson and Kelly Williams should once again see extensive playing time. Williams will man the forward slot opposite Brown, while Nelson will move into the pivot position, replacing the graduated Hollinden. It is by no means an unfamiliar position to Nelson, who played center on his Owensboro Senior High team. Both Williams and Nelson, a pair of 6-7 bookends, racked up comparable statistics last year while amassing almost equal playing time. Williams scored 8.5 ppg and hauled in 4.6 rebounds, and Nelson tallied 6.9 ppg on 51% shooting accuracy and averaged 6.2 rebounds per contest.

The backcourt tandem of Mark Block and David Collins returns, intact. Block, who led the team in minutes-played (30.8 min/game) and assists (111) last year, should be a stabilizing force entering his senior year. The Jasper (Indiana) native, who averaged 11.2 ppg, can be deadly from long range but can also hurt opponents with his deft passing. Collins can also whistle the nets from the perimeter, but draws his rave reviews from coaches and opposing players with untiring hustle and hard work on both ends of the court.

After gaining eligibility in late December last year, junior Clarence James came off the bench to dazzle spectators and opponents with his uncanny jumping ability. The Owensboro (Kentucky) native connected on almost 54% of his shots for 6.4 ppg and worked his way inside for 2.3 rebounds/game. Guards Thurber Davis (2.1 ppg) and Mike Whiteside (.7 ppg) comprise the remainder of the Eagle returnees. Davis provides quickness to the lineup, while Whiteside, who reported to school about 15 pounds lighter than last year, should see a great deal more playing time this season.

Newcomers should play an important role this year, as two redshirts have become eligible, two junior college transfers have joined the team, and three freshmen will be on hand. Local fans will recognize Evansville Central High School product Jeff Strouse, who comes to ISUE following a year at Murray State and another at Lincoln Trail Junior College. Bob Webber, who initially attended Armstrong State College while Creighton Burns was assistant there, spent last season at Jackson (Michigan) Community College, where he averaged 10 ppg and 7 rebounds. Burns says of the Niles, Illinois, native that he fits the mold of the typical ISUE player. . . quick, aggressive, and hard-nosed. Eagle fans are eager to see 6-6 guard-forward Jeff Pennington in action. The University of Florida transfer scored 10 points against both Kentucky and LSU two years ago for the Gators as a freshman. The other redshirt gaining eligibility this year is forward John Morrow who transferred last year from UNC-Asheville after a high school career at nearby Princeton (Indiana) Community. Freshman hopefuls are T L Irwin from Hardinsburg, Kentucky (Breckinridge County High School), and hometown products Steve Hillenbrand (Evansville Memorial High School) and Rick Scholfield (Evansville Harrison High School). All three have the potential to contribute once they have gained a little experience.

"Our biggest problem," Coach Burns noted about the upcoming season, "will be adjusting to playing without the big fella (Hollinden) in the middle."

"We have promised our fans we'll be exciting and fun to watch. We're going to be hustling, scrapping for loose balls, running our traditional fast-break offense, and displaying a wide array of pressure defenses. Wayne (Boultinghouse) created a fine winning tradition here at ISUE. . . I just hope we can keep the ball rolling."



## The Great Lakes Valley Conference

In only three years of existence, the Great Lakes Valley Conference has risen from a necessity for a Division II Great Lakes region basketball conference to receiving an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II national playoffs each year.

The league began only as a thought tossed around by athletic directors from Indiana State University Evansville, Bellarmine College and Kentucky Wesleyan College in 1972. Nothing much came about from these meetings until 1976, when St. Joseph's College and Indiana Central University entered into the talks. Under the leadership of athletic directors Richard Scharf of St. Joseph's and James Spaulding of Bellarmine, this conference began to take shape.

Then on July 7, 1978 the athletic directors from Ashland College of Ashland, Ohio; Kentucky Wesleyan of Owensboro, Kentucky; St. Joseph's of Renesselaer, Indiana; and ISUE met in Louisville, Kentucky, and approved the final constitution and by laws for what is now formally known as the Great Lakes Valley Conference. In April, 1980, Lewis University in Romeoville, Illinois, became the seventh member of the conference.

While the emphasis within the conference is placed upon basketball, the GLVC holds official championships in six other sports: baseball, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis, and track.

In its short history the GLVC has had many highlights, but none could match the 1980-81 basketball season for sustained excitement. Led by NABC All-American, 7-6½ John Hollinden, ISUE won its first four conference games before meeting arch-rival Kentucky Wesleyan, which defeated the Eagles 76-70 and threw the GLVC race up for grabs.

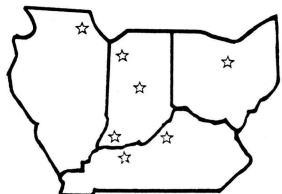
ISUE and Kentucky Wesleyan continued their winning ways, pointing to a showdown between the two conference front runners on the last game of the regular season conference schedule. Needing a victory to insure them at least a tie for the conference title, Wesleyan surged to an astonishing 47-19 lead at halftime versus the Eagles. But in what was surely the most dramatic turn-around in GLVC and probably NCAA history, ISUE roared back only to be held off at the final buzzer by Wesleyan, 74-72.

This set the stage for the first-ever title playoff game in the GLVC's short existence. Not only was the conference crown at stake, but for the first time the GLVC champion was to be awarded an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II playoffs. Defeating an arch-rival twice in one season is considered difficult, but to do it three times is nearly impossible--as Kentucky Wesleyan was soon to find out before a huge Robers Municipal Stadium crowd. In another typical ISUE-Wesleyan match-up, the lead changed hands throughout the contest leading to a dramatic climax even Hollywood producers would have trouble matching.

But contrary to the previous two meetings, an emotionally-charged ISUE team turned back the Panthers, 83-72, to take the crown, and more importantly, the NCAA bid, as well.

With this in mind and the 1981-82 outlook pointing once again to ISUE and Wesleyan, along with improved teams such as Ashland, Indiana Central, and Lewis, the GLVC once again looks to continue its steady rise toward national prominence along with providing its member-schools exciting basketball for years to come.
