Eagle Access Card offers convenience and security

The traditional USI identification card is being replaced by a multi-purpose debit card called the Eagle Access Card that will include a photo of the owner. The card will be used for the same purposes as the previous identification card -University identification, discounts, and Rice Library privileges-with an addition of magnetic stripes that will allow access to other services.

The Eagle Access Card will enable USI employees to deposit a maximum of \$25 in an EagleBucks account and use the card instead of cash at campus copy and vending machines. Copiers and vending machines are being equipped with readers to process debit transactions.

Deposits to the EagleBucks account may be made by cash, check, or credit card at several campus locations including the Bursar's Office, Eagle Access Card Office (University Center near the USI Bookstore in UC132G, now under construction), and cash management centers (CMC). CMCs, similar to automated tellers, can accept cash for EagleBucks and will be installed at the University Center and Rice Library main floor.

Employees also may activate a Sodexho-Marriott dining account on the Eagle Access Card. See story in this issue of University Notes for more details.



The old identification cards will not be accepted after August 27. Therefore, employees must arrange an appointment for a photo with **Ms. Kristi Eidson**, Eagle Access Campus Card senior associate, through e-mail or by calling 465-1124. Her office

is located in UC 132G near the USI Bookstore.

The following dates are available for employee photo appointments. Hours are 8:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday - Thursday and 8:30 a.m. - 3 p.m. on Friday.

Using the Eagle Access Card for dining

Sodexho-Marriott will offer meal plans, a guaranteed number of meals per week at USI dining centers, and a dining account called Munch Money through the Eagle Access Card. Employees may use the Eagle Access Card for food purchases at the Eagles Nest, The Loft (formerly second floor cafeteria in the UC), and Eagle Express Convenience Store. The meal plan options follow.

Top Flight - includes seven evening meals and two brunches per week in The Loft and \$362 in dining dollars. Cost is \$1,150 per semester. Must be purchased at the Bursar's Office on the lower level of the Orr Center.

Platinum Plan - includes 50 dinners or brunches in The Loft and \$300 in Munch Money. Cost is \$600 per semester. Must be purchased at Dining Services Office on the second floor of the University Center.

Gold Card - includes 23 dinners or brunches in The Loft and \$150 in Munch Money. Cost is \$300 per semester. Must be purchased at Dining Services Office.

Munch Money - may be used for food purchases at any of the three Sodexho-Marriott establishments. Minimum of \$50 increments. Must be purchased at Dining Services Office.
