**WILDERNESS TRIP SPONSORED BY SUB.** A 120-mile wilderness canoe trip down the Green River in Utah is being planned by the Office of Student Activities from August 4-17, 1978.

At the completion of the 120-mile float through some of the most beautiful wilderness in North America and at the meeting of the Green and Colorado Rivers, participants will be jet-boated 70 miles up the river to Moab, Utah. The jet-boat will travel through the heart of Canyonlands National Park where cliffs rise hundreds of feet on both sides of the river. Participants will camp on canyon floors, and ample time will be allowed for personal exploration of the local flora and fauna.

The trip is being sponsored by SUB and the Association of College Unions-International, Region 9, which is made up of universities and colleges in Indiana and Illinois.
