



POLLUTION EDUCATION UPDATE. ISUE is offering a three part program aimed at educating the public about pollution problems and alternative solutions in Southwest Indiana. Included are six TV programs to be aired on Channel 9 beginning this Friday; three community forums; and a manual written in easy-to-understand language explaining the pollution problems and alternatives.

The first Pollution Update TV program will be "The Health Effects of Pollution." TOM

ZELLER, ISUE geology instructor, and DR. ANDREW JORGENSEN, assistant professor of chemistry, will participate in addition to other community leaders and environmentalists. The program will be shown on Friday, February 23 from 8:00 to 8:30 p.m.

The pollution topic was chosen because Southwest Indiana has experienced a significant industrial and population growth in the past two decades and the growth has been coupled with a growing concern about environmental questions in four areas - water, air, coal mining, and nuclear energy.
