**Humanities Forum:** Dr. Michael Makin, associate professor of Russian at the University of Michigan, will speak on "Russia: Culture in Crisis" in at 11 a.m. in Forum I. The public is invited. The program will address the question of Russian cultural identity as reflected in the contradictory and often painful development of Russia and the Soviet Union, and the recent radical changes. Dr. Makin received his undergraduate and D. Phil. degrees at the University of Oxford and spent a year as a British Counsel exchange scholar in the Soviet Union. His book, *Marina Tsvetaeva: Poetics of Appropriation*, an account of one of the finest Russian poets of the 20th century, will be published this year by Oxford University Press.
