**ISUE MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAMS  
WILL PLAY IN POST-SEASON TOURNAMENTS.**  
For the second time in three seasons, ISUE's Screaming Eagles have earned a berth in the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Tournament to be played in Dayton, Ohio. The Eagles were assured of a tournament bid when they clinched the Great Lakes Valley Conference championship Saturday night by defeating Kentucky Wesleyan 79-72.

ISUE will face Northern Michigan in the opening game of the tournament Friday at 7:00 p.m. (EST). At 9:00 p.m. (EST) Eastern Illinois will take on the host team, Wright State. The championship game will be played Saturday at 9:00 p.m. with the consolation game being played at 7:00 p.m.

Only 250 general admission tickets were made available to ISUE. The \$6.00 gains admission to both the Friday and Saturday games. Attempts are being made to obtain extra tickets for Eagles' fans. For ticket and transportation information, contact the Athletic Office at extension 1846.

The Student Union Board, along with Student Activities has arranged a tournament package available to ISUE students, staff, faculty and their immediate families which includes round-trip transportation, double or quad accommodations at the Sherridan Motel, and a party Friday night in the Athenian Room at the Sherridan. The buses will leave Friday, February 19 at 9:00 a.m. (CST) and return Saturday following the championship game. The package price is \$35.00 for a double room, transportation, and the party, or \$30.00 for a quad room, transportation, and the party. The deadline for registration is Thursday, February 28. The ISUE Women's Basketball team has accepted a bid to play in the Indiana AIAW (Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) tournament this weekend at Nicoson Hall, Indiana Central in Indianapolis.

At 8:00 p.m. (EST) on Friday, February 29, ISUE will take on Butler, following the St. Joe versus Franklin contest. The championship game will be held on Saturday at 2:00 p.m. (EST). The winner will advance to the Midwest AIAW tournament.

Several students, faculty and staff have indicated an interest in attending the tournaments. Since travel time may necessitate missing classes, proper arrangements should be made by faculty for class work to continue or be made up. Members of the Men's and Women's Basketball teams, the Pep Band, Cheerleading squad and Pom-pon squad should be excused from Friday classes. The Men's Basketball team will miss Thursday classes also. Other students traveling to the tournament should make arrangements with individual faculty members to make up any work missed on Friday.

**ISUE MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BOWLERS IN CLASSIC**, DAVE BAUMEYER rolled a 696 series Saturday to pace host ISUE to the mens' team title in the Screaming Eagle Bowling Classic at Evansville's Franklin Lanes.

ISUE scored 2,945 pins to roll past second-place Southern Illinois, which had 2,775. The University of Evansville, Indiana University and Indiana State University rounded out the top five in the 12-team men's division.

BAUMEYER was backed by teammates JEFF CROWLEY (633), TIM FICKAS (566), JEFF JONES (535), and GREG NEUMAN (515).

ISUE Women bowlers placed fourth in the seven-team women's division.
