Christmas lights in student housing

The USI Student Housing Association is sponsoring a holiday decorating contest in the student housing apartments on the campus with displays to be judged on Sunday, December 4 and the winners to be announced on Monday, December 5. Residents of each building will be competing for cash prizes. Displays are expected to feature holiday lights and be up throughout the week.

Health Care Technology Conference

Wednesday, December 7, 5 to 7 p.m.

Deaconess Health Science Building, Johnson Hall, Deaconess Hospital New technology in the health care profession will be demonstrated by USI health professions students as part of a class project. Students in the fields of respiratory therapy, radiologic technology, dental assisting and hygiene, nursing, and occupational therapy will be represented. Fifteen different displays will show new technology like the Transcutaneous Electrical Nerve Stimulation (TENS) unit that is operated by a 9-volt battery and patient controlled to block pain, that can replace shots from the dentist. Other displays will show an alternative to using needle injections for carpal tunnel and tendinitis; better measurement of hearing loss; jet ventilation on infants, the newest technology in respiratory care, and other new technological advances in the medical profession. Students will be making presentations and will be open for questions. Judy Holstead and Ann White, the USI faculty members who teach the class, will be at the conference.

A high school career planning class lunches at USI

Demonstration of "lunch-view" conducted by Nancy Bizal, USI instructor in administrative services, for a class of nine students from North High School. The "lunch-view" is a program in career planning and professional development to teach students how to interview at a meal, a common event in the job search. The students will be served a three-course meal similar to what is served at a nice restaurant. Ms. Bizal will address how to handle meal etiquette so that the job seeker feels more comfortable with eating and can concentrate on effectively answering the questions of the interviewer. She advises the students to keep in mind that the interviewer is thinking "Why should I hire you?" during the entire interview process. Ms. Bizal routinely offers this exercise to USI students in her business classes.
