The Ford Center, a 10,000-seat downtown arena, is the home of Evansville's hockey team, the IceMen. Physical Activities Center

The Physical Activities Center (PAC) has been the home of the Screaming Eagles for the past 32 years. Opened in 1980, the PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, and is the arena for the USI basketball and volleyball teams.

Games of regional and national interest have been played on the center court of the PAC during the past 19 years. USI has hosted the 1993, 1994, and 1996 men's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; the 2009 men's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 women's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 and 2001 women's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; and the 2000 and 2004 GLVC Volleyball Tournaments.

A true home court, the USI women's basketball team has a 214-79 home record since 1993-94, a .730 winning percentage.

With padded chairback seats, back-supported bleacher seats, and a top-of-the line scoreboard and video board, the Physical Activities Center is one of the top Division II athletic venues in the region.

Experienced Eagles look to bounce back

With four starters and 10 letterwinners returning from a youthful squad that showed promise down the stretch a year ago, the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team enters the 2012-13 season with renewed optimism and high expectations.

A year ago, Head Coach **Rick Stein** was entering the season with the tough task of replacing 75.5 percent of its scoring output and 69.8 percent of its rebounding total from the previous season. That translated into what turned out to be the youngest team in the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

Despite a 9-17 overall record and a 3-15 mark in GLVC play, the Screaming Eagles ended the season on a positive note when they defeated Kentucky Wesleyan College, 78-69, in Owensboro, Kentucky.

The win not only came over the eventual GLVC Tournament finalist, but it was the Eagles' first road win of the year and a big step in the development of a team that featured seven freshmen, four sophomores, and two seniors.

Looking forward to the 2012-13 season, the Eagles have 73.5 percent of their scoring and

80.2 percent of their rebounding back from last year's roster.

That includes last year's leading scorer, junior guard **Stephanie Carpenter**, and second-leading scorer, sophomore forward/center **Anna Hackert**.

Carpenter, who is one of five juniors on USI's roster this year, averaged 10.9 points per appearance as a sophomore and recorded 20 or more points in three of the final four games of 2011-12. In USI's last six games, Carpenter averaged 16.5 points per contest while shooting 41.2 percent from the field and 40.8 percent from behind the arc.

In addition to Carpenter, USI's backcourt includes junior guards **Ariel Barnes**, **Jessica Parker**, and **Aubrey Minix** as well as sophomore guards **Taylor Stevenson**, **Mariah Nimmo**, **Brierra Young**, and **Libby Ogden**.

Barnes, who started the final seven games of the year, averaged 5.4 points and 1.8 assists per contest last year. As a starter, Barnes contributed 6.4 points and 2.6 assists to USI's offense.

Stevenson showed signs of good things to come when she scored seven points in USI's win over Kentucky Wesleyan and pulled down seven rebounds in its win over Saint Joseph's

College. She will likely see an increased playing role in 2012-13 after playing in a season-high 23 minutes in USI's season finale last year.

Both Minix and Nimmo saw limited playing time in their first year with the Eagles, though Minix saw more time down the stretch as a three-point threat.

Parker, Young, and Ogden are all new to the Eagles' roster in 2012-13 after transferring from NCAA Division I institutions. Parker, who scored 18 points against San Jose State University last November, averaged 3.1 points and 1.7 rebounds as a sophomore at Eastern Illinois University.

Ogden transferred from Indiana University/Purdue University-Ft. Wayne where she played in 17 games as a freshman, while Young made three starts and averaged 4.9 minutes per appearance during her first collegiate season at Jacksonville State University.

Arguably USI's biggest strength a year ago was its frontcourt, which included Hackert, junior forward/center **Nicole Hazemi**, sophomore forward **Brooke Valentine**, and sophomore forward/centers **Mary O'Keefe** and **Cayla Herbst**. Hackert, who had a pair of 20-plus point games

Hackert was second on the team with 10.3 points and 6.0 rebounds per contest, while O'Keefe finished the year with 8.0 points and 3.4 rebounds per game. Valentine chipped in 6.3 points as well as a team-best 6.5 rebounds and 0.9 blocks per outing.

during her rookie campaign, was second on the team with 10.3 points and 6.0 rebounds per contest. She finished the year with four double-doubles, including a 13-point, 12-rebound effort in the Eagles' season finale.

Valentine, who averaged 6.3 points per contest last season, led the Eagles with 6.5 rebounds and 0.9 blocks per outing during her first year in a USI uniform. O'Keefe also provided the Eagles with a scoring and rebounding threat in the low post last year as she recorded 8.0 points and 3.4 rebounds per contest.

Hazemi provided the Eagles depth and experience off the bench as a sophomore last season, recording 4.3 points and 2.7 rebounds per appearance, while Herbst averaged 3.0 points, 2.8 rebounds, and 0.8 blocks during her first year of collegiate basketball.

USI begins the year with exhibition games against the University of Evansville (November 3) and Southeast Missouri State University (November 4).

The 2012-13 season officially tips off November 9 when the Eagles take part in the University of West Florida Tip-Off Classic in Pensacola, Florida.

USI begins its 15-game home schedule November 17 when it hosts Kentucky State University. The Eagles' duel with the Thorobreds also starts a stretch of eight consecutive games at the Physical Activities Center, USI's longest home stretch of the season.

Included in the Eagles' homestand is the USI

Thanksgiving Classic November 24-25 and USI's GLVC-opener against the University of Missouri-St. Louis January 3. USI also hosts defending GLVC Tournament champion Maryville University January 5 to conclude its eight-game homestand.

Following bouts at the University of Illinois Springfield and Quincy University, the Eagles begin their GLVC East Division slate when they host Saint Joseph's January 17 and the University of Indianapolis January 17.



Junior forward/center Nicole Hazemi averaged 4.3 points and 2.7 rebounds a year ago and is one of just two players with two years of experience in a USI uniform.

A three-game stretch that includes visits to Kentucky Wesleyan (January 21), the University of Wisconsin-Parkside (January 24), and Lewis University (January 26) precedes what will be

one of the most anticipated matchups in USI women's basketball history.

When the Eagles host Bellarmine University January 31, it will be a matchup between Stein and former USI Head Coach and USI Hall of Fame member Chancellor Dugan, who took the Bellarmine job this past summer. Stein, USI's all-time winningest coach with 214 victories, helped Dugan to 159 wins as an assistant coach for eight seasons before taking over in 1999.

USI's homecoming and its "Play4Kay" game is February 9 when the Eagles host Wisconsin-Parkside. The Eagles conclude the regular season with Senior Night and a bout with Kentucky Wesleyan February 28 at the PAC.

GLVC Tournament play begins March 3, with the quarterfinal, semifinal, and championship rounds to be contested March 7-10 at the Ford Center in Evansville. The NCAA II Midwest Region Tournament is March 15-18, while the NCAA II Elite Eight is March 26-29 in San Antonio, Texas.



MEET COACH STEIN

Rick Stein '92 guided the University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team to the 2011 GLVC East Division crown after leading the Screaming Eagles back to the NCAA II Tournament in 2010.

In 2010-11, Stein's Eagles finished the season with a 16-11 overall mark and a 12-6 record in GLVC play as they captured their first GLVC regular-season championship since 2001. He also became the first coach in the program's history to eclipse the 200-win plateau when his squad defeated eventual GLVC Tournament champion Lewis University during the regular season.

Stein, who is 214-159 (.574) in 13 years as the Eagles' head coach, became the program's all-time leader in wins when he recorded his 160th career victory, surpassing former Head Coach Chancellor Dugan, in USI's 80-75 win over Wayne State University December 29, 2008.

In 21 seasons as an assistant coach and head coach for USI women's basketball, he has had a hand in 373 of the program's 521 victories (71.6 percent of USI's all-time wins).

The 2001 GLVC Coach of the Year has been a major factor in four conference championships, three GLVC Tournament titles, all eight of USI's NCAA II Tournament appearances, and two NCAA II Elite Eight appearances.

A year ago, Stein led a young group that featured nine newcomers and five returning players to a 9-17 overall record and a 3-15 mark in the GLVC. His 2011-12 squad showed flashes of good things to come, especially in the final month of the season.





In 2009-10, Stein's squad finished 22-9 overall, 13-5 GLVC, and hosted a first and second-round GLVC Tournament cluster. In his 11th year at the helm of the Eagles, Stein directed USI to a 7-1 mark against the GLVC East Division, a division that produced three NCAA II Tournament squads. His Eagles advanced to the NCAA II Tournament for the first time since 2004 and the eighth time in the program's history.

Four years ago, his squad finished 14-13 (6-11 GLVC) and was just one win shy of qualifying for the league's post-season tournament, despite having just three upperclassmen on the roster.

The 2007-08 Eagles were one of the most competitive groups in the GLVC despite their 10-17 overall mark and 5-14 record in league play. His team held second-half leads in nearly every contest in a league that featured six NCAA II Tournament teams and the 2008 national champions.


In 2006-07, Stein guided the Eagles to a 16-12 overall record, 10-9 in the GLVC, and back to the GLVC Tournament. His squad also earned a victory over eventual NCAA II Great Lakes Region champion Drury University.

The 2005-06 season saw Stein lead the Eagles to a 15-15 overall record, 7-12 in the GLVC, despite losing nearly 70 percent of his team's offensive output and nearly 80 percent of his squad's rebounding output from the previous season.

His squad battled through multiple injuries to post a 14-14 overall record, 7-13 in the GLVC, and qualified for the GLVC Tournament in 2004-05.

In 2003-04, Stein led the Eagles to the program's seventh 20-win season, posting a 20-10 mark and a 12-8 record in the GLVC. His Eagles returned to the NCAA II Tournament for the seventh time in the program's history.

Despite a rough 2002-03 campaign, Stein and his coaching staff brought in a strong recruiting class that set the stage for a return to national competitiveness. In 2003-04, USI had the sixth-best turnaround in Division II, with USI improving by 12 wins from the previous year.

In 2002-03, Stein and the Eagles were forced into a rebuilding year after losing five seniors and more than 60 points and 25 rebounds per game from the 2001-02 squad. With only one returning starter, Stein and his staff had a young team competing for a spot in the GLVC Tournament late in the season and finished the year with an 8-19 overall record.

The 2001-02 season saw Stein's Eagles post a 27-6 overall record, 16-4 GLVC, win a second straight GLVC Championship, and appear in the NCAA II Great Lakes Region Tournament for the second straight season. Stein also led the Eagles into the national spotlight with his squad being ranked nationally for 37 consecutive weeks between December 2000 and December 2002.

In just his second season at the helm, Stein led USI to a 28-4 record and the biggest season-to-season turnaround in school history (+13 wins). Stein, who earned GLVC Coach of the Year honors, directed the Eagles to the GLVC Championship, GLVC Tournament Championship, an NCAA II Tournament appearance, and an appearance in the NCAA II Elite Eight for the second time in the program's history.

Stein went 15-12 overall in 1999-00, tying the record for most victories for a rookie head coach and setting the record for best winning percentage for a rookie coach (.556).

A member of the WBCA, Stein is a 1992 USI graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration. He joined the Eagles' program in 1991-92 as a student assistant under former Head Coach Chancellor Dugan. He was promoted to head assistant coach in 1994 and promptly helped Dugan and the Eagles to their best season as a varsity sport at USI.

In his eight seasons as an assistant, Stein helped Dugan amass a 159-73 record with four straight NCAA II Tournament appearances (1994-95 to 1997-98) and three GLVC titles. The Eagles were the NCAA II Tournament finalist and produced the first perfect season in GLVC history (20-0) in 1997.

A native of Crete, Illinois, Stein was a two-year starter on USI's men's basketball team from 1989-91. During his tenure as a player, Stein helped USI to an appearance in the NCAA II South Central Region Tournament in 1989-90 and a win over Division I University of Wisconsin in 1990-91. Before joining USI's team, he played basketball at Parkland College in Champaign, Illinois, and earned an associate degree. Parkland finished as the NJCAA Division II runner-up in 1988 and fourth nationally in 1989.

Stein and his wife Kari have a son, Alex, and a daughter, Mallorie.

In 2001-02, Head Coach **Rick Stein** led the Screaming Eagles to their second straight Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament title.

In 21 seasons with the USI women's basketball team, eight as an assistant and 12 as head coach, Stein has been a part of 364 Eagle victories, eight NCAA II Tournament appearances, five regular-season GLVC titles, and a three GLVC Tournament championships.

Stein has participated in 71.6 percent of USI's all-time victories.

In his second season, Stein was voted the GLVC Coach of the Year after leading USI to a 28-4 record and both the GLVC regular-season and tournament championships.

Stein, who led USI to its second NCAA II Elite Eight appearance in 2000-01, is USI's all-time winningest coach with 205 victories. He also is the only coach in the program's history to eclipse the 200-win plateau.



Soaring through the years of success

The University of Southern Indiana women's basketball team enters the 2012-13 campaign seeking its ninth NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 18 seasons. The last 18 seasons have not only produced eight NCAA II Tournament appearances, but have seen the Screaming Eagles make it to the NCAA II Sweet Sixteen three times and to the Elite Eight twice. USI finished as the runner-up in 1997.

In addition to its NCAA II Tournament success, USI also has been one of the top programs in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. The Eagles have won four GLVC regular-season titles since 1995 and have won the GLVC Tournament a record-tying three times. In 10 trips to the GLVC Tournament, the Eagles are 10-7.

Note: Since 1994, the Eagles have had five players earn All-America honors.

After beginning the 1996-97 season with a 1-1 record, the Eagles won 29 straight games as well as the GLVC and NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Championship. USI went on to win its first two games in the NCAA II Elite Eight before falling in the national championship game to North Dakota. USI also became the first and only team in GLVC history to go 20-0 in conference play. USI finished the season with a school-record 30-2 mark and finished second in the national rankings.

Missing out on the NCAA II Tournament in 1999 and 2000, the Eagles exploded back on to the national stage in 2001. The Eagles finished the 2000-01 season with a 28-4 mark and won a share of the GLVC regular-season title. The Eagles went on to win the GLVC Tournament championship as well as the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Championship for the second time in school history.

Quick fact: The Eagles have hosted the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament twice. However, the two times the Eagles have gone to the Elite Eight, they have won the regional tournament in the state of Michigan.



All-American Impact



Kathy Lauck was the first of five USI players to earn All-America honors since 1994. Lauck averaged 20.1 points and 9.2 rebounds per game as a senior and led the Screaming Eagles to their first winning season in eight years. USI finished the season with a 17-10 mark and a 12-6 record in the GLVC. Lauck, who is third all-time at USI in career scoring with 1,573 points, earned GLVC Player of the Year honors in 1994 and was a two-time All-GLVC selection. She was recognized by three publications for All-America honors.



In 1995, **LeAnn Freeland** became the second player in school history to earn All-America honors. Freeland, USI's all-time leading scorer with 2,269 points, finished her career at USI as a three-time All-American. However, her sophomore campaign in 1994-95 stood out as she became the first player in school history to earn National Player of the Year honors. During the 1994-95 season, Freeland averaged 24.4 points and 9.2 points per game. She finished her career as USI's all-time leader in six statistical categories, including rebounds (961). The two-time GLVC Player of the Year holds 16 school records and was a three-time Academic All-American.



Eileen Weber was recognized by two organizations for All-America honors in 1996-97. She also earned All-America honors for her efforts during the 1997-98 season. In 1996-97, Weber helped lead the Screaming Eagles to a 30-2 record and the NCAA II National Championship game. She started her career at USI by earning GLVC Newcomer of the Year honors and ended it by earning GLVC Player of the Year honors. Weber is second all-time at USI in career points (1,847) and career rebounds (842). She averaged 17.8 points and 8.0 rebounds per game as a senior in 1997-98 and 15.4 points and 6.4 rebounds as a junior in 1996-97.



After a quiet first three seasons, **Elizabeth Prewett** broke out as a senior during the 2000-01 season. She averaged 15.0 points and 9.2 rebounds per game to lead USI to a 28-4 record and its second trip to the NCAA II Elite Eight. Her efforts landed her first-team All-GLVC and All-Region honors. She also was selected GLVC All-Tournament Team and was named the MVP of the 2001 NCAA II Great Lakes Regional Tournament. Prewett is ranked 14th all-time at USI in career scoring (837) and eighth all-time at USI in career rebounds (589). In 2000, she helped the USI volleyball team to a share of the GLVC regular-season title.
