Tri-State youngsters are offered a variety of fun learning opportunities ranging from the ancient dinosaur to modern chemistry experiments in "Super Summer for Children" classes which start Monday, July 10, at the University of Southern Indiana and Evansville Day School.

In addition, the USI Office of Continuing Education is sponsoring a Computer Day Camp the week of July 10 for youngsters in grades three through five, and a one-day trip on Wednesday, August 16, when children age 6 to 12 can explore the exhibits at the new Indianapolis Zoo.

Zoo attractions include the Waters Building, Indiana's largest aquarium with more than 200 species of fish; polar bears and penguins; the whale and dolphin exhibit; the Plains Area featuring animals from Africa's Serengeti; an encounter area where children can meet domestic animals "up close and personal"; and the zoo's own Boulder Gang.

The Super Summer classes are one-week sessions that start each Monday, July 10, 17, and 24. Most of the classes will meet from 9 to 11:30 a.m. The registration fees are \$40 and \$45, depending on the class. The computer camp fee is \$125, including lunch each day. The zoo trip is \$45, including transportation, zoo admission, lunch, and snacks.
