## ISUE/MUSEUM TO SPONSOR ANTIQUES LECTURES.

Nationally known antiques author, lecturer, and dealer Helaine Fendelman will present two special March programs on American Art and Antiques in Evansville. At 7:30 p.m. on Friday, March 7, she will offer an admission-free, illustrated lecture, "What is American Folk Art?" in Room UC 350. There will be a reception in the President's Suite following the lecture. Because seating is limited,

reservations must be made with the Museum receptionist no later than noon on Thursday, March 6.

"How to Know About American Antiques" will be the topic for a mini-workshop from 10:00 a.m. to Noon on Saturday, March 8. Fees for this session, to be held at the Museum, will be \$7.50 for non-members and \$5.00 for members. Registration should be made with Coordinator of Education Gary Orth no later than Noon on Friday, March 7.

A 1964 graduate of Washington University in St. Louis, Mrs. Fendelman participated in the Boston University, American and New England Studies Program in 1978. Since 1978, she has been Curator of the Rye (New York) Historical Society. The author of Tramp Art, published by E.P. Dutton & Co., Inc. in 1975, she was Guest Curator for the Museum of American Folk Art in that same year and organized the "Tramp Art" Traveling Exhibition for the Museum in 1976-77.

Mrs. Fendelman is a member of the Appraisers Association of America, Inc. She is the daughter of MR. and MRS. ALBERT A. WOLL, MR. WOLL is a member of the Board of Trustees of Indiana State University.

**TWO ISUE PLAYERS NAMED TO ALL-TOURNEY TEAM.** Despite ISUE's two losses at the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Tournament, the attending media and sports information directors were sufficiently impressed with the team's play to name two ISUE players to the All-Tourney Team, JOHN HOLLIDEN and DAN LABHART.

It is a special honor for a team to be in fourth place in a tournament and place two people on the 6-man team. Others members included three from Northern Michigan (the tournament champs) and one from Wright State (3rd place).

HOLLIDEN and LABHART join Cortez Collins who made All-Tourney team in the 1978 regional at Eastern Illinois, making it three all-tourney players in two tournaments.
