CHILDREN'S DAY CARE CENTER TO BEGIN SECOND YEAR. The ISUE Children's Day Care Center will begin its second year at the beginning of the Fall Semester, August 28. The Day Care Center is open to pre-school age children whose parent or parents attend classes at ISUE. While the student is in class or studying, the child is cared for at the Center.

The Day Care Center is open five days a week from 7:45 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and from 7:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday. Children who are between the ages of 3-6 years may attend. A child may attend a full day, everyday or may enroll on an hourly basis.

CAMPUS APARTMENTS OPEN BY FALL. *Ralph Kent*, Coordinator of Off-Campus Housing, has announced that one building of the Campus Apartments, located on the corner of Schutte Road and the Access Road to the University, will be completed and available for rent on September 1, 1975. The building will house eight apartments: six with two bedrooms, which will rent for \$225.00 per month; and two with one bedroom, which will rent for \$185.00 per month. (Utilities will not be furnished.) The apartments will be unfurnished; however, if furniture is desired it may be leased through the apartment complex. Upon renting one of the apartments, a \$100.00 security deposit must be paid, and a one-year lease signed.

Mr. Kent has been notified that three more buildings with eight apartments in each, will be completed by November 1, 1975. The projected completion date for Phase I of the Campus Apartments, which will include thirteen buildings with eight apartments in each, is December, 1975. Other future plans for the Campus Apartments include two more phases of thirteen buildings each, as the demand for the apartments arises, a party house, swimming pool, and shuffle board courts. Campus Apartments are owned by *Bob Griese*.

EXTENDED SERVICE COURSES TO BE OFFERED BY ISUE. In addition to the regular fall schedule of evening courses offered on campus, Indiana State University Evansville has scheduled courses at three additional locations in and around Evansville. The extended service courses will be offered at Mt. Vernon High School in Posey County, Deaconess Hospital in Vanderburgh County, and Castle High School in Warrick County. The extended service courses are part of an experimental program aimed at increasing the opportunities for citizens of southwestern Indiana to participate in public higher education.

Courses scheduled at Castle High School are Freshman Composition, beginning on Monday, September 8; Principles of Accounting and General Psychology, beginning on Tuesday, September 2; and Principles of Management, beginning on Wednesday, September 3. General Psychology will be offered at Mt. Vernon High School on Wednesday evenings, beginning September 3. Two courses--Human Anatomy and Business Communications--are scheduled at Deaconess and will begin on Thursday, August 28.

The extended service courses are being offered through the Office of Continuing Education.
