NAMES IN THE NEWS. **Mrs. Cecelia C. Correll**, supervisor of cashiering, has been appointed University representative on the West Side Improvement Association Board of Directors.

Dr. Charles F. Petranek, Sociology Department chairperson, recently demonstrated the use of social simulations for **Mr. Peter Bosteen** and **Mr. Claus Jarlov**, educational consultants for the Ministry of Education in Denmark. They were interested in the course, *Simulated Games of Society*, in which 10 simulations are played, with no lectures; students learn social psychological concepts from the simulations, debriefing about the simulations, writing in a journal, and writing essay questions on tests. The Danish educators want to apply educational techniques developed by Dr. Petranek to teaching methods in Denmark. They also sought ideas from the University of Michigan and Rutgers University.

Dr. Sandra M. Singer, assistant vice president for Academic Affairs and director of Graduate Studies, made a presentation, "A Dermatoglyphic Analysis of Autism," at the 19th annual meeting of the Behavior Genetics Association on June 9 at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville. **Ms. Lori DeVillez** and **Ms. Mary Jane Cosgrove**, recent USI psychology graduates, are co-authors.

SUVON ERROR. It has been discovered that Indiana State University, Terre Haute, and Indiana University-South Bend have the same numbers for the extensions 4100 through 4494. Dialing the 237 prefix will automatically put you in South Bend. To reach those extensions at ISU, you must dial 8-812-237-(four-digit extension). DO NOT dial 1 in front of 812; that will put you off campus in Terre Haute.

CHINESE EXHIBIT ON COLUMBUS TRIP. "Son of Heaven: Imperial Arts of China" is the feature of a weekend trip August 18 to Columbus, Ohio, sponsored by the Office of Continuing Education. The exhibit is part of Columbus' observance of the 500th anniversary of Christopher Columbus' discovery of America. It includes items tracing more than 26 centuries of Chinese history, some of the finest examples of imperial art and recent archaeological finds, including four of the life-size terra cotta warriors buried around the tomb of the first emperor. Also featured are imperial robes and furniture, lacquer and silver vessels, porcelains, carved jades and bronzes, paintings, and sculptures. Eighty percent of these objects have not left China before. The \$185 registration fee covers transportation and two nights of lodging, plus visits to the China exhibit and to the Columbus Museum of Modern Art.
