Nationally syndicated columnist Sylvia Porter will give the Commencement address at the 1974 Commencement Exercises of ISUE on May 9, 1974. The exercises will be held at the Vanderburgh County Civic Auditorium.

## LIBRARY ITEMS ON DISPLAY

A bibliographic study of contemporary developments in the energy crisis, prepared by Dale Shook, Instructor in Business, and the Library staff, is on display in the Library. Entitled, "From Fuel Shortages to Product Mix: Business and the Energy Crisis," the reference bibliography provides a systematic approach for studying literature dealing with the Energy Crisis and the business ramifications. It supplies selected references in specific categories, including basic texts, government publications, state-of-the-art reviews, conference proceedings, abstracting and indexing services, technical reports, and resources that may be contacted for additional information.

"Utopia ... Past & Present" is a display on communal societies, including historic sites as the Shakers, the Oneida Community and New Harmony, Indiana, and present communal experiments, Koinonia, Morning Star, and Padanaram, located near Bedford, Indiana. The display has special contributions from Josephine Elliott, Special Collections Librarian and University archivist, and Dr. and Mrs. Donald E. Pitzer. Dr. Pitzer is associate professor of history. Kenneth Vance, assistant professor of English, also has a number of portraits of life in the Padanaram commune in the display.

Also on display is a book listing the automobiles registered in the state of Indiana in 1908, courtesy of Mr. Paul Grimes, Superintendent of the Physical Plant. The book belonged to Mr. Grimes' grandfather, Mr. L.M. Myers of Kingman, Indiana. Mr. Grimes explained that the motorist carried this book with him at all times--so when he encountered another automobile on an Indiana road he could quickly check the license number in his book and find out who it was! The Library staff invites you to scan the lists for automobiles registered in 1908 to citizens of Evansville, Princeton, Mt. Vernon, Wadesville, Ft. Branch and Poseyville. You just might find your own grandfather's automobile listed!
