## ***Bid date changed***

The date has been changed to Tuesday, August 1, for the receipt of bids on the \$4.1-million University Center expansion project. The bid opening will be at 2 p.m. in UC350. The original bid date of July 25 was dropped because another large corporation (Aztar) is receiving bids on that date.

The University Center was opened in 1974. Ground is expected to be broken in September for the one-year project to double square footage, add a second entrance on the south, expand dining facilities and conference rooms, increase Student Life office space, and provide student recreation areas.

### **Leadership workshop:**

Dr. Dennis Waitley, author of the best-selling *Empires of the Mind*, will present his program, "Lessons to Lead and Succeed in a Knowledge-Based World," on Thursday, July 27, in Mitchell Auditorium. The workshops will run from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. and 1 to 2:30 p.m.

Dr. Waitley is a U.S. Naval Academy graduate and former Navy pilot whose best-selling books also include *Psychology of Winning*, *Seeds of Greatness*, *The New Dynamics of Winning*, and *Timing Is Everything*. His "Psychology of Winning" audiotapes have made him "the most-listened-to voice in the world, outside

of musical recordings and broadcasts."
