NEW MUSEUM DIRECTOR NAMED

Glen Palmer Ives has been named the Director of the Evansville Museum of Arts and Science. For the past four years he has been Director of the Museum of Arts and Science in Macon, Georgia. His ten years experience in the museum field includes work at the San Diego Natural History Museum in California and in the exhibits and art departments of the Illinois State Museum in Springfield.

As director of the Macon Museum, Ives developed permanent collections, initiated a library, developed an environmental program and broadened and upgraded the exhibit program. His work in improving the image and public awareness of the Museum attracted clubs and societies to meet there as he increased adult membership along with professional and financial support. This enabled him to set up long range plans and increase his staff and budget.

Ives, 39, was born in St. Charles, Illinois. He received a M.S., Education in Art degree, from Northern Illinois University in 1963 and has completed over 30 graduate hours toward an M.S., Education in Biology.

BUSINESS EDUCATION SEMINAR AT ISUE

The chairman of the Department of Business and Vocational Education at the University of North Dakota, Dr. John L. Rowe, will be the speaker at the second annual Indiana State University Evansville business education seminar on Saturday, October 14 at the Evansville Campus.

A major authority in skills of typewriting, Dr. Rowe has authored and co-authored over thirty typewriting textbooks, including the popular Typing 300 for high schools. He has also compiled over 150 professional articles and research abstracts dealing with teacher education in shorthand, typewriting, basic business courses, student teaching, and vocational education.

Dr. Rowe has given lectures and demonstrations to state, regional, and national professional meetings, to colleges and universities, and to business organizations in forty-eight states. In 1968 Dr. Rowe conducted a world-wide lecture tour as a consultant in Business Education sponsored by the United States Government.

The business education seminar, sponsored by the Division of Business at Indiana State University Evansville, will begin at 9:30 a.m. on October 14. The seminar is open to business education teachers at the high school level, business education student teachers, and business education college students.
