Dan Engelke, who was instrumental in the 1970s in establishing ceramic and design programs for the University of Southern Indiana Art Department, will be the judge for the 1989 Student Art Exhibition, April 23-30.

Engelke was with USI for seven years. He now is an associate professor of art at Purdue University and his work has won numerous regional and national honors. He has created installation sculptures since 1973, with his most ambitious project being "Lightpath," installed in 1987 in Lake Michigan, jutting from the Indiana Dunes State Park beach.

Engelke will lecture on his work and the Student Art Exhibition at 6 p.m. Thursday, April 20, in Room 109 of the Technology Center. At 10 a.m. Friday, April 21, he will present a video-illustrated lecture on the Lake Michigan sculpture, also in TC109. Both programs are open to the public.

The Student Art Exhibition will be set up in the University Conference Center. It will open with a public reception from 1 to 4 p.m. Sunday, April 23; the awards ceremony will be at 2 p.m. The exhibition will continue on public display through April 30.
