Dr. Donald E. Pitzer, assistant professor in history, I.S.U.E. will appear as a guest on the television series, "Current Comment," Saturday, April 19, 1969, 1:00 to 1:30 p. m. on WEHT-TV, Channel 25. Dr. Pitzer will discuss his essay "Christianity in the Public Schools," which appears in the recent book PROTEST AND POLITICS: CHRISTIANITY AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS, published by The Attic Press. Appearing with Dr. Pitzer will be two members of the history faculty at ISU-Terre Haute, Dr. Robert G. Clouse and Dr. Richard V. Pierard, who edited the volume and also contributed essays.

Hosting the half-hour discussion series will be Seymour Brodsky, I.S.U.E. speech faculty.
