GOVERNOR'S APPOINTMENT. *Frank Stanonis*, Chairman, Division of Science/Mathematics, and Professor of Geology and Geography, has been appointed Commissioner of Environmental Quality for Kentucky by Kentucky Governor Julian Carroll. The appointment is effective this month. *Dr. Stanonis* will be on leave of absence from Indiana State University Evansville to accept the assignment.

As Commissioner of Environmental Quality, *Dr. Stanonis* will have the offices of air pollution control, water pollution control, solid wastes and disposal, and sewage treatment report to his office.

MASTER HYPNOTIST TO BE ON CAMPUS. Master hypnotist, Edwin L. Baron, will appear in shows at ISUE on Friday, January 16, 1976 for two performances. On the stage, Dr. Baron creates laugh-packed entertainment with hypnotism. Off the stage, he is often more busy helping science explore hypnotism's vast range of possibilities in bringing benefits to human life and living.

In the hands of Dr. Baron, hypnotism has been used to aid amnesia victims regain memory, make childbirth more comfortable and easy for expectant mothers, help stammerers, aid in mental and nervous disorders, reduce overweight persons, and pull teeth. Once, during a demonstration at the University of Illinois Medical School, Dr. Baron held a match under a doctor's arm without disturbing him, jabbed a needle into a nurse's arm without her feeling it, and had six hypnotized subjects fighting "ants" at an imaginary picnic until he rescued them with equally imaginary DDT. Under his purposeful prodding, a hypnotized nurse confidently recalled a so-called "previous life."

Dr. Baron received a Ph.D. in Psychology from Loyola University. He is credited with having first put hypnotism to use for the benefit of overweight persons in group sessions, a phase of his work which has received exceptionally wide publicity. Weight losses, as much as 30 pounds in four weeks, have been recorded in connection with his work.

Dr. Baron will be appearing in two shows. The 11:00 a.m. performance will be held in the Pyramid Lounge free of charge, and the 8:00 p.m. show will be held in A126 at 8:00 p.m. at the price of 50¢ for students, and \$1.50 for non-students. The Ed Baron show is sponsored by the ISUE Student Union Board.

BLACK HISTORY BICENTENNIAL PROGRAM. The Human Relations Institute and the Division of Education are co-sponsoring a performance of "Treasure Island" by the Earth Productions, Ltd. on Monday, January 19 in A28 at 1:00 p.m. in connection with the Black History Bicentennial. The group is an arts education and theatrical touring company which is used as a medium of communications to motivate minority children to participate in the arts. The Chicago-based group has performed before neighborhood social service groups, public institutions, and various youth centers across the country. All students, faculty and staff are invited to attend.

VOLUNTEER FAIR. The Volunteer Action Center of Evansville will sponsor a Volunteer Fair for ISUE faculty and students on January 21 and January 22 in the Pyramid Lounge. Volunteer Fair offers ISUE students the opportunity to volunteer their services to the community agencies of their choice. Fifteen agencies will be represented at the Volunteer Fair. In past years, psychology students have constituted the majority of volunteers from ISUE, but students of any major can register for volunteer service during the two-day fair. The agencies will have displays and representatives of the organizations to discuss volunteer possibilities with the students. This is the third year for the Volunteer Fair. The program is directed by Don Wells, Director of the Volunteer Action Center.
