  1. To be a non-administrative faculty committee for guidance of the administration for the general development of the college.
  2. To determine the needs for and functions of faculty committees.
  3. To receive nominations for, interview candidates for, and appoint members to faculty committees.
  4. To deliberate faculty concerns and formulate recommendations for administrative considerations in such areas as the following: (a) Tenure; (b) Salary and Promotions; (c) Faculty travel; (d) Institutional planning (including accreditation); (e) Library; (f) Constitution and Faculty handbook; (g) Publications; (h) Student Affairs; (I) Teaching Load; (j) Summer School;

  1. Establish and elect members to a By-laws committee.
  2. Discussion with Dr. Duncan.
