

Dr. Larry Arp—Athletic Director


Dr. Larry Arp, Associate Professor of Business, begins his third year as Director of Athletics. Dr. Arp received his undergraduate degree from the University of Northern Iowa and his graduate degrees from Adams State taught business education and coached high school football and basketball in Iowa, Colorado and Nevada. In 1972, Dr. Arp joined the School of Business faculty where he teaches classes in business administration, administrative systems and computer information systems. Before being appointed

Director of Athletics, Dr. Arp had served for several years on the USI Athletic Board on which he continues to serve.


Chris Diaz—Head Trainer

Coach Colavecchia feels Diaz is probably the most important member of the athletic staff. He has been associated with the soccer program for five years. Diaz graduated in 1981 from University of South Florida with a physical education degree, and earned a master's degree from Indiana University. He is a certified strength and conditioning specialist as well as a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association. Diaz was host athletic trainer during the 1987 NCAA Division II Cross Country Championship and volunteer host athletic trainer during the tenth American Pan American Games.

Diaz will be assisted by Kelly Phelps, a sophomore majoring in English from Hazelton, and Jason Scales, a freshman from Boonville.







Head Coach—Tony Colavecchia

Starting into his second season, Head Coach of the Screaming Eagles Tony Colavecchia has brought new enthusiasm to the USI soccer program. Colavecchia says he has been fortunate to receive financial support from the community to allow him to elevate the program. He was named GLVC Coach of the Year last season and his team finished as champions.

During a four year association with the University of Evansville, the Skegness, England, native was also director of athletics at UE's British campus, Harlaxton College. After two years, Colavecchia was transferred to Evansville where he served as assistant to UE Head Coach Fred Schmalz. Colavecchia credits Schmalz with influencing his career and feels that coaching at UE helped him gain support valuable to promoting the USI program.

The 30-year-old soccer enthusiast holds a F.A. coaching license and a United States Soccer Federation B' license. He has served as an Instructor for the U.S.S.F. Region II Olympic Development camps, and is recognized as a state coach for both boys and girls. Colavecchia has spent the last two years developing the Evansville Spirit soccer club of eight teams ranging from U12 to U19. His role as coaching director to the Spirit club has helped gain support for the USI program.

Colavecchia has played professionally and as a collegiate midfielder in England. He graduated from St. Paul's College, Cheetenham, England in 1980 with a degree in physical education.

Assistant Coach—Moulton Cato

Joining the USI coaching staff is Moulton Cato, former USI player and alumni. Cato was born in St. Vincent, West Indies, and raised in Birmingham, England, where he developed as a player. He moved to Canada where he played CONCACAF and the Canadian National Team program.

Cato was captain of USI's team for 3 years including the 1982 NCAA play-off team defeated by Oakland 1-0. He graduated in 1985 with a degree in communications and went on to earn his masters degree while serving as assistant coach at Western Kentucky University.

During Cato's playing career at USI he received an All-American honorable mention and was selected as both an All-Region and All-Conference player.

He will assist in all facets of coaching. Coach Colavecchia has given Cato the responsibility of coordinating the fitness program and assisting in the monitoring of each player's academic progress. Colavecchia is thrilled that an ex-USI player is on the staff and feels that Cato's serious and mature approach to the game and school will in turn produce a better student athlete.

Assistant Coach—Rob Schoenstein

Schoenstein begins his first season in college coaching after four years with Evansville high school programs. Schoenstein, a graduate from St. Louis High School who is completing an accounting degree, has a soccer pedigree that should assist Head Coach Colavecchia in all areas of the game. Schoenstein received All-State recognition as a high school player and played successfully at the University of Evansville. He was captain of the Aces in his senior year and led them to a NCAA semi-final appearance in 1985. The 25-year-old Schoenstein, sixth in career scoring at UE with 27 goals and 15 assists, steps into college coaching after guiding the Mater Dei boys' program for the last three years and assisting with the Memorial girls' high school program. Schoenstein has taught at USI and UE soccer camps.

1989 Outlook

Although USI lost three starters from last year's GLVC championship team, this year's schedule has been strengthend to incorporate teams which have received national ranking. USI's schedule includes top-ranked opponents Oakland U, University of Missouri-St. Louis, Gannon U, Lewis, East Stroudsburg, plus NAIA National champions Sangamon State.

The installation of floodlights will allow more community and student support and a majority of games are during the evening. A new permanent seating facility will accommodate 500 spectators and complement existing facilities.

Looking at the returning players and newcomers to the program, the coaching staff are optimistic about the challenges that lie ahead. Colavecchia feels his team will be good enough to perform well enough to be ranked in the top 20.



The Goalkeepers

Matt Bauvelt should be in a strong position to become the No. 1 goalkeeper. For most of the year he played behind now graduated senior Scott Emery and junior Randy Johnson. Freshman Jimmy Morrow also will compete for the No. 1 jersey.

The Defense

Last year the USI defense conceded 16 goals and achieved 11 shutouts in 20 games. John Heerdink, who captained the defense, has graduated but the remainder of the back four remains intact. Jamison Egler, who received All Mid East honors, and vice captain Scott Hehn are among the top returning defenders.

The Midfield

Returning in midfield is captain and senior Kevin Swords, who has proved to be a threat with his long-range shooting ability. Joining Swords is left-sided player Chris King who tallied 30 points with 10 goals and 10 assists. King received All Mid East and GLVC conference honors. Junior Ron Sweeney, who proved to be a versatile player during the fall of '88 also will be in contention for a midfield spot. Two local players, UE transfer, Robert Bennett, and Memorial student Joseph Lattner will be strong contenders for places in the "engine room" of the team.

Forwards

A new scoring threat is expected to be found in sophomore Eric Schoenstein an All Mid East selection.

Freshmen

Shane Gibson from Chesterfield, England, is likely to make a contribution to the attacking pair of the USI front line.

Wayne Kumar, younger brother former USI player, Paul Kumar continues USI's strong Canadian affiliation. Kumar is a native of Scarboro, Ontario and is expected to have an impact on the USI distribution from midfield.

Travis Marx, from Evansville's Mater Dei High School, brings his tenacious style to the USI squad. Marx is a versatile player who can operate in midfield or forward.



We Remember Donald James Rumpler

(1968-1989)


Don Rumpler was a student-athlete who everyone loved to see perform well in the classroom or on the field. There is no question that he would have been in strong contention for a starting role in USI's much-improved lineup. Rumpler was killed in an automobile accident during the early hours of Saturday, July 22, 1989.

Rumpler was initially recruited by former USI soccer coach Mike Ferrell at an Indiana University soccer camp. He did not possess the soccer ability of many of his peers but he made rapid progress and became a much improved athlete. He became more conscientious and gained confidence on the field. Towards mid season, it was apparent Don had become a big strong athlete who could panic even the most experienced defenses. Former assistant coach Kevin Larkin recognized Don's potential as a forward player and encouraged a starting role for him.

Although Rumpler never started a game during the '88 season he appeared 12 times off the bench. His contributions progressed with the season and he was used as a rotating forward to relieve the successful striking partnership of Eric Schoenstein and Andy McCulloch.


During his playing time Rumpler scored four goals, with none more important than the winning goal in the Great Lakes Valley Conference championship game. Rumpler appeared as a substitute with 25 minutes remaining and broke the dead lock with a solo run that found Darren Wolf unmarked in the penalty area. Five minutes later he made another similar solo run and clinched the game against powerhouse Lewis University on a snowy field in Romeoville, IL.

Rumpler will be sadly missed by the USI team, the athletic staff and all the faculty and students who knew him at USI. Don Rumpler was a superb student athlete whose attitude, temperament and ability made him an excellent role model for future USI players.




