New library attractive, accommodating

The University will celebrate groundbreaking of the new \$25.7 million David L. Rice Library at 4 p.m. Tuesday, June 1, on the south lawn of the existing library.

With 151,660 gross square feet, the five-story structure – four stories above ground – will be the tallest on campus. Roughly twice the size of the existing library, the new brick and limestone facility will feature a front rotunda and curved rear façade with floor-to-ceiling windows in several key areas.

“We believe the new building will offer great variety and flexibility in study space and learning options,” said Ruth Miller, library director. “In addition, it will be a very attractive and comfortable space, where we can better display the collections and offer the services the library provides.”

Edmund L. Hafer and Associates and Woollen Molzen and Partners designed the new library, which also will carry the name of USI’s first president. The plans include:

- ▶▶ A main level housing circulation and reference areas, media and listening rooms, a two-story periodical reading room, and two combination computer/library instruction labs.
- ▶ A coffee shop, located at the library entrance, with both wired and wireless access.
- ▶▶ Classrooms and a small auditorium on the lower level, which will have an outside entrance.
- ▶▶ Bookstacks, reading rooms, and a variety of study spaces on the second, third, and fourth floors.
- ▶▶ University Archives and Special Collections on the third floor.
- ▶▶ A grand (two-story) reading room spanning the second and third floors and a smaller, more intimate reading room on the fourth.
- ▶▶ Fixed computer workstations and wired and wireless access for laptops in addition to the two combination computer/library instruction labs.
- ▶▶ Approximately 30 group-study rooms that will accommodate from three to four people to as many as 10 to 12 people.
- ▶▶ A variety of seating including tables, carrels, rocking chairs, and soft seating.

Deig Brothers Lumber and Construction Co. is the general contractor. Completion of the new library is anticipated in spring 2006. The public is invited to attend the groundbreaking, which will be followed by an ice cream social.

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USI the GLVC’s top 2003-04 program

The University of Southern Indiana Department of Athletics is the top program in the GLVC after sweeping both the All-

Sports Trophy and the Commissioner’s Cup in 2003-04. This is the first All-Sports championship for USI since 1993-94.

The Screaming Eagles won the All-Sports Trophy by nine points, the largest margin of victory since Lewis edged USI by 9.5 points in 1986-87. In the 23-year history of the trophy, USI has finished first three times (2003-04, 1993-94, 1982-83), second nine times, third once, and fourth three times.

USI also won the Commissioners Cup by three points over Lewis University and became the first GLVC institution to win both awards. Northern Kentucky University won the first-ever Commissioner’s Cup in 2002-03.

Consistency was the key in the Eagles winning both trophies. The 15 individual programs averaged between a third- and fourth-place finish with two conference championships (men’s and women’s cross country), five second-place finishes (men’s basketball, soccer, and tennis; women’s golf and volleyball), and three third-place showings (men’s golf and women’s softball and tennis).

USI Athletics received the trophies at the GLVC Banquet May 26 in Indianapolis.

NHT preparing for 2005 world premiere

New Harmony Theatre Artistic Director Scott LaFever directed a reading of Thom Thomas' new play, *A Moon To Dance By*, at Circle in the Square Theatre on Broadway in April. The play is slated for a world premiere production at The New Harmony Theatre in July 2005.

A Moon To Dance By is a poignant romantic drama set in New Mexico two months before the start of World War II. Based on actual events, the play explores the relationship between Frieda Weekley and her grown son Monty.

Frieda's passionate affair with D.H. Lawrence led her to leave her husband and children in England. Years later, after Lawrence's death, Frieda lives near Taos, New Mexico, with her Italian lover, Angelo. When Monty comes to visit, mother and son see each other for the first time in 30 years and grapple with their needs for atonement and self-discovery.

LaFever assembled an outstanding cast for the reading, including Salome Jens as Frieda, Robert Cuccioli as Angelo, and Larry Gleason as Monty. Jens has appeared in countless movies and television shows. She played the role of Norma Marcus in *Seconds* with Rock Hudson and appeared in the original production of Arthur Miller's *After The Fall* directed by Elia Kazan.

Cuccioli's Broadway credits include *Les Miserables* and the title role in *Jekyll and Hyde*, for which he received the Drama Desk Award and a Tony Award nomination. Gleason is a veteran of The New Harmony Theatre stage, where he was last seen in

2003's production of *The Foreigner*. On Broadway, he appeared in the Tony-nominated *Wilder, Wilder, Wilder*.
