"YE OLDE MADRIGAL CHRISTMAS FEASTE." The ISUE Mid-America Singers will present Elizabethan Christmas Dinners, open to the public, on December 4, 5 and 6, at 8:00 p.m. on the ISUE campus.

The Christmas Dinner, which has been a tradition in the tri-state area for the past ten years, includes the colorful pomp and ceremony of Merrie Olde England appropriate for the Christmas season. A regal brass quintet will herald each course and ceremonial event.

As in the past, guests will be treated to the splendor of the entrance of wassail and toasts, procession of boar's head and feast, entrance of the flaming pudding and the singing of carols and madrigals drawn from the Medieval and Renaissance periods. A new musical program will be presented under the direction of ISUE's Director of Music, Willard Kesling.

The first processional into the Royal Dining Chamber is "Carols by Candlelight" accompanied by brass, recorder, and harpsichord. While guests enjoy the main course, roast beef of Olde England, strolling carolers will serenade. During the entertainment, the singers will present A Day for Dancing. This work is a set of nine Renaissance dance carols based on the sacred lessons read on Christmas Eve. These carols are accompanied by flute, oboe, bassoon, and percussion.

The program will also include dances of the period such as the Pavanne, Galliarde, Torch Bransle and Contrapasso Nuovo. The dancing will be accompanied by a consort with five recorders, percussion, harpsichord and brass quintet.

The Mid-America Singers who will be costumed in elaborate finery of the period include Cheryl Ancona, John Ancona, Jenny Anderson, Troy Beasley, Tarina Birdwell, Patrick Bradford, Janet Campbell, Beth Clark, Kathy Craney, Chris Daly, Debbie Davidson, Karen Doom, Duwayne Greene, Rodney Haskins, Dave Nixon, Todd Parker, Genie Scherer, John Schutz, Steve Skeels, and Gary Woodward.

Jack Schriber will play the Head Lord of the Castle, and Sue Schriber will play His Ladye. The Lord High Chamberlain will be Wayne Aldridge, and the Drunken Friar will be Harold Tepool. Jane Hormuth and Cladia Rayl will be Wenches. Jesters will be Bob Branch, Randy Pursley, and Ted Ubelhor. Scott Jeffries will be the Tumbler and Mark Sanderson the Page.

The recorder consort under the direction of Dr. Clark Kimberling includes Margaret Kimberling, Helen Templeton, and Dr. Ralph Templeton. Mark X. Hatfield will play the harpsichord. The percussion instruments will be played by John Vanvorst.

Dr. Riggs has been active for many years in professional organizations for psychologists, especially in the South, and has had professional and personal contact with many of the great names in psychology in our day such as Carl Rogers and Abraham Maslow.
