



**GRANT APPROVALS ANNOUNCED.** The Human Relations Institute of ISUE has received \$246,608 in funds for training school personnel in innovative curriculum, Eighth District congressman David L. Cornwell announced Friday.

The grant was approved by the Office of Equal Educational Opportunity of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare under the Emergency School Aid Act.

The funds will enable the continuation of a project aimed at overcoming inadvertent racism and sexism in school curricula.

*GLENN KINZIE*, Professor of Education and Director of HRI, will coordinate the program to assist desegregation efforts in four school corporations: Evansville, East Chicago, Gary and Hammond.

Also, ISUE has received notice from the Indiana Commission on Higher Education that its request for a Title I grant in the amount of \$20,124 has been approved. The grant project, entitled "Inservice Training in Consumer Education for Social Service Agency Personnel," will serve social service agency representatives in Vanderburgh, Warrick, Gibson, Spencer, Pike, Dubois, Posey, and Perry Counties of Indiana. *SYLVIA WEINZAPFEL*, Continuing Education Specialist, is project director.

The ISUE Title I grant proposal was one of ten accepted of nineteen submitted.

Those desiring to audition should make an appointment with the Humanities Division, extension 1734.



# 'DESK-R-CIZE'

Are you exercising? This Desk-R-Cize is the third in a series of exercises designed to encourage physical well being for those of us who spend most of our time sitting down.

Daily exercise will help you continue to be a physically and psychologically fit worker.



3. SEATED ISOMETRIC PRESS

Tones and strengthens chest, arm and shoulder muscles.

Sit upright in chair and place palms of hands together at a position in front of upper chest, elbows well out to each side. Press hands firmly against each other so that strong muscle effort is produced but no actual movement takes place. Continue pressing action for 3-5 seconds then relax for an equal period and repeat. Do 6 repetitions in all. Avoid holding your breath; instead coordinate your breathing so you breathe in during the relaxation phase, and out while pressing hands together. If you have blood pressure problems, avoid this exercise.
