REMINDER FROM PERSONNEL OFFICE

The Personnel Office reminds department heads and others involved in the selection and employment processes regarding potential non-work study student employees that employment cannot commence until the following steps have been completed:

- 1. The department head must request in a memo to Personnel Office employment of the student. The memo must include proposed beginning date and hours per week to be worked.
- 2. The Personnel Office must verify eligibility of the student for employment and then will advise the department head whether the person is eligible and has been approved for employment.
- 3. The prospective student employee must complete in the Personnel Office an application form and a W-4 form.

SECOND JUVENILE JUSTICE SESSION TO BE HELD ON CAMPUS

Five local personalities will participate in a public discussion of juvenile justice at ISUE on October 3, 1974. A film, "Children in Trouble," based on the Howard James book, "Children in Trouble: A National Scandal," will introduce the subject matter.

The program, funded by an Indiana Committee for the Humanities grant, is part of a state-wide study program offered through the state universities by Indiana Higher Education Telecommunications System.

The session, open to the public, will run an hour and a half, beginning at 11:00 a.m. in Room 126 at ISUE.
