THURSDAY IS THE DAY TO STOP SMOKING. Registration winds up today for this year's Great American Smokeout Thursday. A highlight of 1984 events will be the adoption of smokers by non-smokers concerned about their friends' health. In addition, watch for Smokeless Sam, an ISUE student decked out as a cigarette package to emphasize his non-smoking message. His community efforts include joining Mayor Michael Vandever in a news conference, and visiting local hospitals and public schools. He will tour the ISUE campus Wednesday, and at 2 p.m. Thursday at Eastland Mall, will adopt a local radio personality-smoker as part of his campaign.

ISUE art student Glen Mathews is the creator of the Smokeless Sam character. ISUE Nurse Sandra Lawrence is in charge of the '84 Smokeout.

Registration of Smokeout participants will be completed Wednesday afternoon at the University Center. They -- along with all adoptors of Smokeout entrants -- will be eligible for a drawing of prizes donated by West Side businessmen. The prizes include some frozen turkeys, while "cold turkey" sandwiches will be featured in the University Dining Center Thursday.

PROJECT SAFE APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED. Project SAFE low-income utility assistance applications are being accepted at Southern Indiana Gas &

Electric Co. for households with persons aged 60 or older. Any household with persons aged 59 or younger should apply at the local Community Action office. The 1985 Project SAFE income guidelines will be at 125 percent of poverty (ranging from \$6225 for one person to \$17,100 for six) for the general population and 150 percent of poverty (ranging from \$7470 for one person to \$20,520 for six) for aged 60 and older households.
