



**BLUE CROSS-BLUE SHIELD CHANGE NOTED.** Effective July 10, 1977, the University's contribution to the cost of new higher Blue Cross-Blue Shield rates will increase while cost for covered faculty, administrators and bi-weekly employees will remain the same.

**WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION INJURIES.** The Personnel Office wishes to remind administrators, faculty and clerical/support staff that Dr. Victor Johnson is authorized by Indiana State University Evansville to handle the University Workmen's Compensation injuries.

When an employee is injured on the job, he or she will be referred to Dr. Johnson. This includes student workers. In case of serious injury or if Dr. Johnson is not immediately available and it is necessary to refer the injured employee to a hospital emergency room, Dr. Johnson will handle the case after emergency treatment. He reserves the right to treat, approve for sick leave or return to work.

At the hospital emergency room, the injured employee will give the name of Dr. Johnson as the University physician. If the employee is unable to communicate this information, the person accompanying the employee to the hospital should do so. Dr. Johnson's office address is 2301 West Michigan Street. The procedure in case of injury is the same as outlined on page 46 of the Handbook for Clerical and Support Personnel of Indiana State University Evansville.


While a student at U of E, the vivacious blonde was a cheerleader, a member of AOPi sorority and helped organize the Acettes, a pompon group.
