2.5% INCREASE IN ENROLLMENT

The fall enrollment at Indiana State University Evansville is 2713 students according to the Registrar's Office ten day report. The 2713 figure represents a 2.5 % increase over the 1972 fall semester. The breakdown according to classes is 1073 freshmen, 549 sophomores, 425 juniors, 341 seniors, and 345 classified as other students. "Other" students are students who are not enrolled in a specific degree program or students who are taking classes at ISUE for an interim period while seeking their degree from another institution.

Full time students number 1726 and part time students (enrolled in less than 12 credit hours) number 987.

Male students still out-number female students in the student body with 61 percent or 1660 males and 39 percent or 1053 females. However, enrollment by women has increased by 11.2 percent over last year.
