Gregory W. Biggs of 719 Treelane Drive, Newburgh, is among 14 students at the University of Southern Indiana who have been chosen national outstanding campus leaders and will be included in the 1988 edition of Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges.

Campus nominating committees and editors of the annual directory chose the students on the basis of their academic achievement, service to the community, leadership in extracurricular activities, and potential for continued success. The USI students join an elite group selected from more than 1,400 institutions of higher learning in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and several foreign nations.

Biggs is president of the USI Psychology Club and a member of the Psi Chi National Honor Society in Psychology, USI Social Work Club, and Pi Kappa Alpha National Social Fraternity. He also has been a student worker in the Division of Social Science, co-chairman of the Mid-America Psychology Conference, and a member of the USI Social Science Advisory Board, the St. Johns Men's Club at Newburgh, and the Evansville Zoological Society.

Biggs is certified as a lifeguard, water safety instructor, and adapted aquatics instructor, and in first aid and CPR. Aside from being named to the USI Dean's List, Biggs was presented the Academic Achievement Award for 1986-87 in the USI Department of Psychology. He has a 3.6 overall grade point average out of a possible 4.0.
