A LOOK AHEAD...

The 1989 baseball Eagles, under second year head coach Gary Redman, are looking to finish this season on top of the Great Lakes Valley Conference. To get there, the Eagles swing through a tough early season schedule and hit all the GLVC opponents hard.

The Eagles return 10 lettermen from last year's 23-25 team and have added several top junior college and freshmen to the roster. Redman believes if his pitchers stay healthy, the Eagles will soar to the top of the conference.

The ultimate goal of this year's squad is to attain a birth in the NCAA Division II baseball playoffs. Finishing in one of the top four conference positions and then winning the conference tournament will allow the Eagles to reach that goal.

Gary Redman enters his second season as USI's head coach looking to improve on last year's 23-25 record. Redman has 10 lettermen returning and has several quality newcomers. He is a 1975 graduate of then Indiana State University-Evansville and knows what it takes to be successful at baseball.

Redman is in his 13th year of coaching. His teams over the past nine years have a combined batting average of .302 (2071 for 6848), including last year's USI team average of .309. He has coached over 50 .300 plus hitters over the past nine years.

The 35-year-old coach is also active in assisting the many community baseball leagues. He has worked summer camps for younger players for the past 13 years and volunteers his services when needed.

Redman and his wife Geralyn have two sons, Josh 4 and Jace 2 years.
