INTERSESSION

One hundred twenty-seven students are enrolled in the intersession courses offered at ISUE May 11 through June 11. Three divisions are offering courses. They are Division of Science and Mathematics, Human Anatomy; Division of Business, Seminar in Contemporary Marketing; and Division of Education, Practicum in Reading Instruction.

Intersession courses allow for flexibility in the schedule. Intersession also makes it possible for a student to enroll in a summer course, complete it in a month or less, and have time for summer employment.

The regular summer session will begin on June 11, 1973. Second summer session will begin July 18.
