EDITOR/AUTHOR FEATURED IN HUMANITIES FORUM. Bob Shacochis, an award winning author who now is Visiting Writer in Residence at the University of Missouri and fiction editor for The Missouri Review, will present a fiction reading for the Humanities Forum, slated at 2 p.m. Friday, February 8, in UC 350-351.

The Virginia native and former Peace Corps volunteer is the recipient of a James Michener Award, a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts, and Playboy's Best New Fiction Award. His stories have appeared in Esquire, Playboy, The Paris Review and many other magazines. His first collections of short stories, Easy In The Islands, now is available from Crown Publications and will appear in paperback this summer from Penguin. His books will be available in the University Bookstore at a discount, while he is here.

FINANCIAL AID WORKSHOP SUCCESSFUL. More than 100 people attended the Fourth Annual Tri-State Financial Aids Workshop held Sunday, February 3. The event was sponsored by the Office of Admissions and the Office of Financial Aids as a public service to Tri-State residents. Financial Aids Director W. Harold Calloway led the program, and staff from both admissions and financial aids answered questions about college attendance and procedures for obtaining financial aid during the 1985-86 academic year.
