ISUE PROFESSOR RECEIVES AWARD

Dr. Thomas R. Walsh, Assistant Professor of Education, has been notified that his article, "The American Green of Charles Bessey," has received the Seller's Award for best published article in the Nebraska History, a historical quarterly, published by the Nebraska State Historical Society.

The award is presented annually by the Nebraska State Historical Society in honor of Dr. James Sellers, a former department chairman of the History Department at University of Nebraska. The award consists of a monetary award and an inscribed plaque.

Dr. Walsh's award winning article deals with Charles Bessey, former Chairman of the Botany Department at University of Nebraska. Dr. Bessey was a prominent American Botanist who was involved in the early development of the study of botany. He introduced the idea of laboratory study in the botany curriculum.

Dr. Walsh will be honored at the October meeting of the Nebraska Historical Society.
