THREE HUMANITIES FORUM PROGRAMS PLANNED FOR NEXT WEEK.

Two programs featuring folk music and a program featuring a sculptor are planned by the Humanities Forum for November 28, 29, and 30.

On Wednesday, November 28, Jackie Torrence, a professional storyteller, will spin her tales of wonder and suspense. Specializing in storytelling for adults, Ms. Torrence draws heavily on the Black folklore and mountain lore of her native North Carolina, though many of her stories are improvised

or embellished anew with each telling. The 4:00 p.m. session will be held in Room SC192.

Also, on Thursday, November 29, the Patoka County Boys will perform a concert of country and folk music from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m. in Room A28.

James Loney, a sculptor and the director of the Children's Museum at Muncie, Indiana, will hold lecture/workshop sessions on the subject of his work November 29 and 30 at ISUE as part of the Visiting Artist series.

On Thursday, November 29, Loney will hold a 7:30 p.m. lecture in Room TC 109 and on Friday he will hold a 10:00 a.m. lecture and workshop, also in Room TC109.

Admission to these events is free and the public is invited to attend.
