SOLAR ECLIPSE IS WEDNESDAY. About 85% of the sun's surface will be covered by the moon around 11:25 a.m. Wednesday, May 30, during a rare solar eclipse. It will take an hour and a half for the sun's surface to be covered, and another hour and a half for it to be uncovered.

Those who plan to view the solar eclipse should take special precautions. Because the retina at the back of the eye is burned by ultraviolet light, experts warn that looking at the eclipse can permanently damage a person's vision. Using film negatives or placing filters over telescopes are not safe ways to view the eclipse. The only safe way is projecting its image onto something else. People can view the eclipse from their own yards by putting a pin hole in a piece of cardboard, holding the card flat in front of them and letting light from the eclipse shine through the hole and onto a white piece of cardboard or paper held underneath.

Those whose vision is damaged by looking directly at the eclipse usually complain of blurring at the center of their vision afterwards. The next day the person has a blind spot.
