Students who wish to pre-register for Day only or a combination of Day, Evening and Saturday classes, may do so Monday through Friday, April 21-25. Only currently enrolled students are eligible to pre-register. New and readmission students will register during their orientation, advisement and registration program.

ARCHAEOLOGY CLASS PLANNED FOR SUMMER. ISUE will offer its third season of archaeology field school training during the first summer session 1975. This program is jointly sponsored by Historic New Harmony, Ind. and Harmonie Associates, and will begin June 9 - July 11. The David Dale Owen second geological laboratory in New Harmony will be the site of primary emphasis.

Either 3 or 6 semester hour credits may be earned in Soc. 482 Independent Study in Archaeology and/or Soc. 498 Internship in Archaeology. Enrollment for six credits is encouraged to simplify transportation arrangements. Travel allowance from the ISUE campus to New Harmony will be available for approved car pools. DANIEL SCAVONE, Assoc. Professor of History, has been awarded a National Endowment for Humanities grant to participate in a summer program at the University of Texas at Austin. To run from June 18 to August 13, the program will involve twelve scholars from various fields engaging in an interdisciplinary in-depth study of Augustan Rome, 37 years which were crucial in the development of Western civilizations. On March 22, DR. SCAVONE presented a paper on "Zosimus, Historian of the Fall of the Roman Empire" before the Hanover College U. of Louisville Medieval History Conference. Eight history students accompanied Dr. Scavone on this field trip, sponsored by the ISUE History Club.
